Classes Offered

Theatre I – This class is for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders who have never taken theatre.

This class in an introduction to dramatic performance. Students will explore all areas of theatre arts including basic stage movement, theatre jobs/vocabulary, voice, pantomime, improvisation, choral reading, script writing, performance, technical theatre, and readers theatre. Students will also be introduced to duet and monologue based performances. **There will be one required after school performance.**

J.V. Theatre – This class is for all 7th graders and 8th graders who have taken at least one year of theatre.

This intermediate class will require that students work in all areas of theatre arts including basic stage movement, voice, pantomime, improvisation, script writing, performance, theatre history, technical theatre, musical theatre, and readers theatre. Students will perform monologues, duet, and group acting scenes. This class will build on the skills learned in theatre I. **There will be two required after school performances.**

Varsity Theatre – This is a select class is for any 7th or 8th graders who have taken theatre one and have auditioned and been accepted into the program.

This is an advanced level class that is primarily production based. Students will be expected to work in a group on various types of performances including theatrical, improvisation, and film. Students will experience both onstage and backstage roles. There will be 3 required after school performances as well as opportunities to assist with other after school performances.

Classroom Expectations

Be on time. And ready to work. We begin as soon as the bell rings. If you're just walking through the door as it rings and you still need to put things away/get things out, you're already behind.

Be prepared. Have a pencil and paper every day. Bring other materials/props with you to class (going back to your locker wastes time). Remember that materials/props do not require you or your parents to spend money. Borrow...reuse...recycle...get creative!

Participate. This is the place you can explore different sides of yourself with no fear of judgment because everyone else is doing the same thing(often the teacher is included in that)! It is never the directors intention to make you look like a fool or embarrass you. We look good when you look good. Keep an open mind. The best part of theatre is that there are often no right or wrong answers, just different interpretations.

Be Kind. This is a safe place. It all comes down to trust and respect. Always think about how your words and actions will be perceived by those around you. Keep an open mind. Students are to interact as professionals and personal issues/concerns are to be resolved outside of class time. Conflicts within class are to be brought to the teacher's attention for resolution, if needed.

Work Collaboratively--Class structure is group based and requires students to work with a variety of peers. There is no opt out option.

Follow all routines and procedures regardless of who is teaching. It doesn't matter if it's your teacher, a substitute, your classmates, etc.

The teacher, not the bell, dismisses the class. The teacher will respect your time and will not keep you beyond the bell without very good reason.


Off Limit Areas

Students may enter the following places ONLY with express permission from their director:

- *Director's desk
- *Storage closets and cabinets, file cabinets
- *UIL Unit Set piece Storage
- *Any belongings/props that are not yours (this includes those belonging to the theatre) are also off limits

Grading

For full information on the Benold grading policy, you can check the Benold website. It breaks down to 60% performances, quizzes, tests, major work, and 40% daily work and rehearsal.



Examples of daily work: Daily rehearsals, written work, self and peer critiques

Examples of major work: Scenes, projects, script writing, written quizzes/tests.

Students will often be assigned "group" grades. This is a direct reflection of how theatre works in the professional world. No matter how good one performer may be, it takes the entire cast and crew to keep a show open. To offset this, however, students will often be given a grade based on their individual work on a project/scene in addition to the group grade.

For any classroom procedures not explicitly outlined in this handbook, we will follow the Benold handbook.

Audience Etiquette

Attending a live presentation or performance is an important part of learning about the arts. For many students, this may be their first experience in such a set a setting and they may not know what is expected of them in terms of audience etiquette. This page provides a set of basic etiquette guidelines designed to help prepare students for live performances both in and out of class.

- The success of a presentation or performance depends in part on the audience members...YOU!

- When you help create a supportive and focused atmosphere, you help create the best show experience possible for everyone involved (including yourself).
- -One of the most basic elements of being a great audience member and one of the most important skills anyone can learn is listening.
- Remember, everything you do and say has an effect on a live performance. When you are watching a live presentation or performance, the people on stage can hear and see you.
- Please avoid activities that will distract from the presentation or performance. Help those on stage give the presentation or performance that you deserve by not talking, eating or drinking during the presentation.
- -Please turn off all cell phones. It is rude to send text messages or talk on your cell phone during a performance.
- -Disruptive audience members may be removed from the venue.
- If you enjoyed yourself, please feel free to applaud **at the end** of the presentation or performance to show your appreciation, unless otherwise requested by the artists. Only during a musical theatre performance or another type of performance where there are individual "numbers" should you applaud in the middle of a performance.
- If you see or hear something during the presentation that you especially like, let a member of the company know after the presentation or performance. Audience feedback helps us fine tune future performances.
- -Keep in mind, each live presentation or performance is an entirely unique experience. What you are participating in will never occur the same way twice. That's what makes live theatre so unique.
- Above all, enjoy yourself!

Extracurricular/Afterschool Activities

There are numerous opportunities to explore Theatre outside of class time. Some will be outlined below but there are always new opportunities that arise as we go through the year. These will be announced in class and on the Theatre webpage.

Please adhere to pick up times for all extra-curricular events. The directors cannot leave until all students have been picked up so please respect their time. If you are going to be more than 15 minutes late please call the director or your student to let them know. Repeated late pickups will be taken into consideration when casting future shows. This also applies to field trips, rehearsals, etc...

Auditions

Auditioning for every show is by no means mandatory but is strongly encouraged. We can't tell you the number of times a kid has gotten a part and then come to us to say, "I didn't think I had any chance!" You never know what kind of character we are looking for. Also, any chance to practice your auditioning skills should be taken advantage of.

Why did my child not get a part?

There are many reasons why a child may not get a part. A short list can include behavior/attitude, availability, eligibility, requirements for the show (gender, age, voice, etc...) and ability. It rarely comes down to "talent". Sometimes it may be that the child has had several large roles already and we want to give as many kids as possible that "center stage" experience. The important thing for students and parents to know is this: Arrange a time to meet with the director at least 3 days after the cast list is posted and we would be happy to discuss with you what you did well and what you can improve for future auditions.

Eligibility

The State of Texas has in place the Eligibility Law "No Pass/No Play." All students are required to have a passing grade of 70 for all subjects in order to participate in extracurricular activities. A single failing grade in any class on a report card will deny you the privilege of performing with the theatre group or attending any field trip. Eligibility may be regained if on the next progress report you are passing EVERY class. Your grades have a direct influence on every other student in the play. This problem can devastate all of our hard work, both individually and as a production team.

Here are a couple of hints in order to stay eligible:

Do all of your homework and turn it in on time! The incredible fact is the majority of failures happen simply because students do not complete/turn in their work. A single zero on any assignment can cause your overall grade to drop drastically.

Do not be afraid to ask for help! Check with your teachers to find out when tutorials sessions are available. Every teacher at Benold Middle School is willing to help any student willing to put forth the effort. Ask other cast/crew members. Often there will be someone in your class willing to help you during down time at rehearsals.

NOTE: All student grades are reviewed during casting and while a failing grade will not automatically bar you from this show or future shows. It is just another factor (albeit an important one) in casting.

Rehearsal/Performance Expectations

- NO GUM, FOOD or DRINKS are allowed on the stage area. (Closed water bottles are accepted offstage. Please DO NOT place water bottles on the prop tables.)
- Store all belongings in the designated area(in the classroom and in the cafeteria). Be sure these belongings are not in areas designated for props and set pieces. Backpacks, binders and books should not be backstage.
- Costumes and Props are to be treated with respect at all times and placed in their designated areas (neatly hung on hangers, etc.) following all rehearsals and performances. Do not eat or drink anything but water while in costume without director's permission
- -Follow directions the first time given. We must maintain theatre safety at all times and it helps us not waste time.
- -Be on time for rehearsal/call. This means being ready to begin work at the right time, not walking through the door.
- -Communicate absences/conflicts as soon as you know about them. The number of allowable absences will be communicated at the first rehearsal. Miss more than that and you may lose your spot in the show. There is no such thing as an "Excused" absence in rehearsals and this includes emergencies. We will work with you as much as possible, but rehearsals/performances can't be put on hold.
- -No one may leave a rehearsal or performance until dismissed by the director.
- -Respect all cast and crew members (space, time, feelings, opinions, etc.).

***Performance specifics:

- -No costumes/make-up in the "lobby" or audience—Students are to remain backstage during productions and intermission.
- -Likewise, parents, friends, and anyone else not in the show may not go backstage before the show.
