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

Graduation Requirements

Diploma Ready!

- 26 credits
- CREDITS/CLASSIFICATIONS

 $0 - 5\frac{1}{2}$ Freshman

6 - 11 ½ Sophomore

12 - 18 ½ Junior

19 + Senior

- Rank/GPA provided at the end of the 9th grade year.
- Ranking for local graduation honors is determined by courses in core content areas (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and LOTE)
- Graduation honors for seniors is factored after the 5th six weeks grading period.



For purposes of applications to institutions of higher education, the District shall also calculate a cumulative class rank to include all courses taken [See EIC(Local)].

- Classes start at 7:25 A.M.
- Classes end at 2:55 P.M.

- Session I begins at 7:00
- Session II begins at 11:30






- Students are allowed 4 absences per class per semester
- 5 or more absences in the same class will result in an absence failure (excused or unexcused)
- Students are responsible for clearing excessive absences with their assistant principal
- Students will have to attend tutoring to regain credit according to the campus schedule.






Clubs & Extra-Curricular Activities








Clubs

Extra-Curricular **Activities**

- Athletics Volleyball, Football & Basketball. If you are interested in other sports, please contact the high school coach of that sport.
- Cheerleading and Drill Team determined by try-outs in the spring.
- Other activities include class officers, club officers, One Act Play, UIL Band and Choir contests, Academic UIL, ROTC, Student Council, theater production/stage crew, Key Club, NHS, FCA, HOSA, etc...

Planning for High School

- ✓ Starts with: 8th grade Career Pathways course and a Four-Year Plan
- ✓ Review the 9th grade courses in Xello with your student.
- ✓ Classes are formally selected by submitting your course plan in Xello and approval from high school counselor visit in fall/spring.
- ✓ Choose alternates first choices may not be available during scheduling.





School Year Structure Home Campus

- 18 week classes = 1 semester = ½ credit
 - Example: Health, Professional Communications

- 36 week classes = 2 semesters = 1 credit
 - Example: English 1, Algebra 1, World Geography, Biology, Art 1, Theater Arts 1



School Year Structure Ben Barber Innovation Academy

- Career and Technology courses at Ben Barber may be 1 credit-2 credits.
- One credit courses at Ben Barber are 18 weeks long.(one semester)
- Students who wish to take a Career and Technology course at Ben Barber will need to plan a 1 credit course for the fall and a 1 credit course for the spring. This will fill two blocks of your schedule on either an A or B day.





Requesting Changes

- If you change your mind about the courses requested, you will have the opportunity to make changes until April 26th.
- Instructions will be emailed to you @ April 19 indicating information about your course requests.
- A link to the Change Form will be included in the email.



Requesting Changes

- You will be required to submit your changes in writing.
- Course requests drive course offerings and the amount of sections we offer. Having accurate numbers helps with overcrowding and course offerings.
- The deadline is enforced so that MISD complete personnel adjustment can Scheduling in a timely and Master manner.



Remember:

- You will need a total of 8 credits.
- At least 3 of those credits will be your core classes.
- It is recommended that you take history all four years.
- It is EXTREMELY important that you have at least 4 alternate classes in case your class doesn't schedule.
- Get parent signatures prior to the date that you meet with the high school counselor.
- No changes to your request may be made after April 26th.
