Homeroom teachers will teach Student Success Skills lessons with fidelity to the pacing guide. The school counselor will develop small groups to support specific groups of students.
2 Tier I	By May 2023, SBCE will increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 performing at "Proficient" or "Distinguished" in Reading English Language Arts from 74% to 79% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.	 The administrative team along with 7 PLC facilitators will work with a PLC consultant to further develop the effectiveness and consistent implementation of our PLC teams to guide and enrich instruction. Teachers will regularly utilize diagnostic and summative assessments to form flexible, differentiated, skill/strategy based small groups that directly target student deficiencies.
3 Interventions	By May 2023, SBCE will increase the percentage of ESOL students in grades 3-5 performing on or above grade level in reading, from 53% to 57%as measured by the reading indicator on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.	 Utilize on phonics and vocabulary acquisition through 95 Phonics Core and Vocabulary Surge. Provide targeted intervention and support during daily intervention period based on iready.
