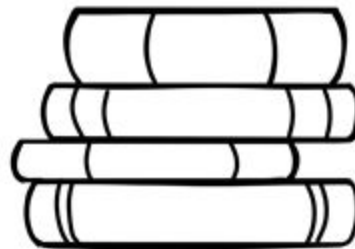


Both the early learning and kids tabs within World Book Online provide image driven content for curious students.



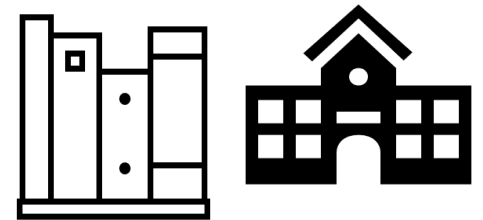

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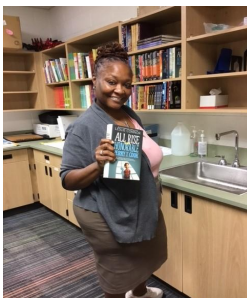
## Media Center Staff

## Book Check Out Policies & Procedures

When students visit the media center, they will be permitted to check out

- 1 book for Kindergarten
- 2 books for 1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> graders.

Students are allowed to keep books for 2 weeks. Beyond 2 weeks, the book is considered overdue. A new book may not be checked out until the previously checked out book is returned.

If the student would like to keep the book for longer than 2 weeks, the book needs to be brought in to be renewed.

Books can be reserved and placed on hold using Destiny via ClassLink.

Charges will be applied to lost and damaged books. Charges for lost or damaged books are to help Wolf Creek School Library replace materials and make it available for future uses.

## Accelerated Reader (AR) Program

The AR program is designed to encourage students to read daily. Your child picks a book at their own level and reads it at their own pace. When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer. Passing the quiz is an indication that your child understood what was read. With their A.R. points, students will earn various rewards.

- AR point goals are differentiated based on reading levels.
- Every book that has an AR Reading Practice Quiz is given a point value. Points are computed based on the difficulty of the book ( readability level) and the length of the book (number of words).
- Students will be rewarded based on the percentage in which they are at in reaching their goals- NOT point total.
- Quizzes may only be taken during school hours.

## Beanstacks

Beanstack makes it easy for your students to track their independent reading, earning virtual badges along the way. Students can also write book reviews and complete activities to further engage with what they have read.
