SUMMER READING PROJECT: *General Book Review*

Objective: This summer reading project aims to encourage high school students to read and analyze a book of their choice. Through this project, students will learn to critically evaluate literature, express their ideas and opinions in a coherent and structured way, and develop their research and writing skills.

Instructions:

- 1. Choose a book:** Students should choose a book of their choice, but it should be age-appropriate and preferably a classic or contemporary literary work. ([List of Some Recommended Books](#)) You may find a book at the following places.
 - a. Purchase a book from a bookstore or online shop (Amazon)
 - b. Borrow/Check-Out a free book from your public library.
 - c. Check-Out a free digital book using the app Sora found on LaunchPad.
 - d. Partner with your ELA teacher to borrow a book from the classroom library.
- 2. Submit your novel selection** using this link: <https://tinyurl.com/TCSummerReading>
- 3. Read the book:** Students should read the book over the summer and take notes on the major themes, characters, and plot points.
- 4. Write a book review:** After reading the book, students should write a book review, which should include the following:
 - a. **A brief summary of the book**
 - b. **An analysis of the major themes and literary devices used in the book**
 - c. **A critical evaluation of the book, including strengths and weaknesses**
 - d. **A recommendation for who would enjoy reading this book**

The book review should be between 500-1000 words, typed and double-spaced.

The Project is Due by Friday, August 11, 2023.

Grading Criteria: Your English teacher will grade your project based on the following criteria:

- **Quality of writing and analysis (50%)**
 - Introduction and conclusion clearly present and summarize the book (10 points)
 - Writing style is clear, concise, and engaging (10 points)
 - Analysis of major themes and literary devices is thorough and insightful (20 points)
 - Critical evaluation of the book is well-supported with evidence and reasoning (10 points)
- **Completion of all tasks (50%)**
 - Brief summary of the book is accurate and complete (10 points)
 - Analysis of major themes and literary devices used in the book is included (10 points)
 - Critical evaluation of the book, including strengths and weaknesses, is provided (15 points)
 - Recommendation for who would enjoy reading this book is provided (15 points)

Total points: 100

Grading Scale:

- 90-100 points: Excellent - thorough analysis, well-written, completion of all tasks
- 80-89 points: Good - solid analysis, well-written, completion of most tasks
- 70-79 points: Average - some analysis, writing is adequate, completion of some tasks
- 60-69 points: Needs Improvement - minimal analysis, writing needs improvement, completion of few tasks
- Below 60 points: Unsatisfactory - insufficient analysis, poor writing, incomplete tasks

Completion Prize: If a student completes the summer reading project with a grade of at least 70%, they will receive PBIS points, the opportunity to win a “grand prize,” and, most importantly, a FREE grade replacement. Therefore, if they score poorly on an assignment during the Fall Semester (next school year), they can use their grade replacement to replace that task.
