Dear Parent/ Guardian

There have been an increasing number of confirmed measles cases in the West Midlands, including in Coventry & Warwickshire. The NHS, Public Health, and Education have been working together to reduce the spread of measles.

Children are routinely offered an MMR vaccine at the age of 1 years, and a pre-school booster at 3 ½ years. The School Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS) supports in delivering and catching-up children who may have missed one or both doses of the Measles Mumps and Rubella vaccination (MMR) when they were younger.

Children in school years 8 & 9 are part of the routine school MMR catch-up programme. Those who may have missed an MMR vaccine are individually contacted. This will continue as normal until the end of the academic year.

**To help boost protection and reduce the spread of measles, SAIS is also offering to give the MMR vaccine to those in school years 7 to 13, who may have missed a dose.**

Please contact the team who will be able to discuss the vaccination, gain consent, and advise when they will be in your child's school.
