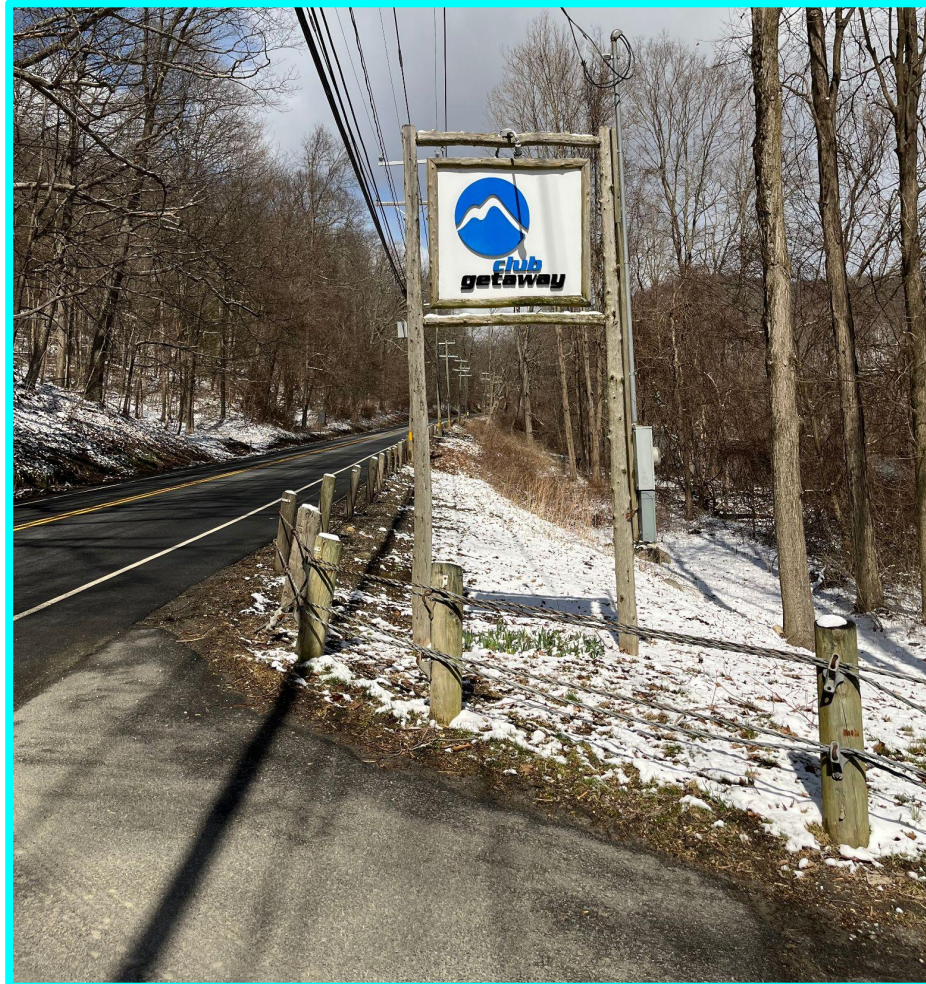

- Reusable water bottle for filling stations
- Hair ties for climbing activities
- Lightweight rain jacket - check the weather!

- Sunscreen and/or hat

Security

- Security entrance gate is closed at all times
- Security guard is stationed at the entrance when students are on the property
- • An extra security guard will patrol in front of student cabins from 11:00 pm to 5:00 am

What happens if my child feels sick?

- The school nurse will have a cabin with ample room in case a child feels sick.
- She will have all medications for families who have submitted a medication form.

Appropriate Behavior

- Being in **assigned area safely** with assigned chaperone at all times
 - Remaining in cabins after designated times
- Following the school code of conduct
 - Including use of technology
- Respond to requests to open cabin doors, appropriately
- Be respectful of cabinmates space and privacy
- Be respectful of the property and clean-up
- Be respectful of staff and other schools
- Packing appropriately and responsibly
- Following **safety** directions of chaperones and counselors
- Trip Contract - shared in February
- Reviewed at a student meeting prior to the trip
- Consequences - removal from activities -> parent pick up
