PTA Family Game Night and Book Swap

We are very excited to host our annual PTA Family Game Night and Book Swap on February 1st from 5:30-7:00. The kids will be excited to bring in their old books on Jan. 26, 29, and 30.

On Feb. 1st, families will enter the main entrance of the school and check in. The kids then get to choose their new books and then head into the gym for game time! In the gym, Mathnasium- The Math Learning Center will have MATH Competition games set up for our families to play. Each student participating in the games will be given a "Passport" to take to each game station. Each station completed will earn a "hole punch" on the passport. Those students who visit every station and fill their passport will earn a prize from Mathnasium! Food will be available for purchase in our Bath cafeteria.

A huge thank you to our Bath PTA and the many volunteers who are working so hard to make this a fun event for our students and families.

What's Happening in the Art Room with Mrs. Koch?

Our third grade artists have just completed their "stained glass" windows, made from construction and tissue paper. Stained glass windows have been created and enjoyed by people around the world. There are specific patterns and colors which represent each culture. This unit addresses the Visual Arts Standards, Historical, Cultural and Social Contexts and Creative Expression and Communication. The kids have begun a still life contour line and 'crayon resist' project which will be painted with watercolors. The contour line and watercolor still life requires the skill and discipline to

render an object as the student observes it. Watercolor painting requires practice to control the material, and to mix colors successfully.

The fourth grade artists have finished their foil 'dragons' which are currently on display on the second floor. Each student created their own dragons, using techniques specific to sharpies and aluminum foil. This unit covers the Visual Arts Standard, Creative Expression and Communication. The kids have recently created their clay 'funny face fish', and will begin glazing them in January. Each 3-dimensional clay fish sculpture is unique and requires the skill and knowledge required to build a freestanding, sturdy ceramic sculpture.

Our fifth grade artists just completed their chalk fruit drawings. They were able to create the illusion of 3-dimensional fruit by using chalk to create highlights, shade and cast shadows. The kids used multiple elements to create a balanced page design as well. The students are now looking forward to making their 3 dimensional masks. They researched the traditional masks of different cultures, and then designed their own. The masks are a fun, 3 dimensional and wearable art piece made with a variety of materials. Both projects represent the use

of 3-dimensionality and cover the Visual Arts Standard: Connections, Relationships and Applications.
