

Mathematics****	4 credits	Must include Algebra 1, Geometry and Algebra 2 or its equivalent
Social Studies	3 credits	Must include 1 U.S. History, 1 World History, and ½ U.S. Govt
Science	3 credits	3 years of lab science: Including Physical Science, Biology and advanced study in one or more of the following: Chemistry, Physics or other physical science; advanced biology or other life science (Anatomy/Physiology)


How do I pick my sequence & course?




For each core subject, click "select sequence" to see your options, pick the appropriate sequence for you.

Be sure to review in detail before hitting submit. NO additional CHANGES can be made by you once you submit your plan.









