Science	3 credits	3 years of lab science: Including Physical Science, Biology and advanced study in one or more of the following: Chemistry, Physics or other physical science; advanced biology or other life science (Anatomy/Physiology)
Physical Education*****	½ credit	Foundations of Physical Education <u>and</u> 1 PE elective <u>OR</u> PE Waiver

Fine Arts** (Visual/Performing/Applied Arts)	1 credit	All students must complete at least two semesters of Fine Arts** taken any time in grades 7-12.


## Where do I go to request courses?


#### Which courses do I need?

Click "complete plan" for the 23-24 School Year Plan.






## How do I pick my sequence & course?




For each core subject, click "select sequence" to see your options, pick the appropriate sequence for you.



One you've selected the appropriate sequence, select from the courses available to you.

Additionally, if you plan out all years, once you've met the graduation requirements for a subject area, the row will turn to green. Rows that remain red have an unsatisfied requirement.

Be sure to review in detail before hitting submit. NO additional CHANGES can be made by you once you submit your plan.






## Scheduling Timeline
