What's Happening with Mrs. Beshara in our Bath Library?

Our Bath Library has so much going on this school year. Aside from the place where students come to explore and embrace reading, they are also learning a variety of skills that will help them now and in the future.

Third grade is always hard at work conducting searches for books in the online catalog and using the Dewey Decimal System to locate the books in our library. They have also become familiar with the digital collections and how to use the different tools in each collection to read or listen to the books that are available. These skills align with the Ohio Department of Education's library guidelines for informational literacy.

Fourth grade has been learning various features of Canva. They are using the program to create items for class projects and real-world scenarios. They have become proficient users in the program and have made great strides in what they are able to create for assignments and individual interests. These skills align with the Ohio Department of Education's library guidelines for digital literacy.

Fifth grade students have spent a significant amount of time working in groups and authoring stories for the Story Walk found on the trail in the Bath Land Lab. They had various lessons on digital citizenship, collaboration, Google Docs, and peer editing as they worked on the project. Their stories will be displayed during the winter months. Different classes will be displayed at certain times based on when the weather is conducive to changing the frames. These skills align with the Ohio Department of Education's library guidelines for creating and distributing information with others in an inclusive environment. This class has also started to get instruction on Canva so they will be able to use it for upcoming projects and assignments.

All classes are working on their keyboarding skills. Third grade is focusing on keeping their fingers on the home row and not looking at the keyboard to find letters. The fourth and fifth grades are working on proper technique with a focus on typing sentences and paragraphs. Fifth graders are also using their typing skills to write creative responses to prompts and questions.

In January, our PTA hosted the annual book fair. This book fair not only gives students the opportunity to think about what they would like to read and gives them the chance to find and purchase those books, it also raises funds to purchase library materials in which all students benefit. This year some of the funds raised were also used to purchase books that were distributed to students to support the Read-a-Thon.

Family Living for 5th Graders

Mrs. Worner, our district nurse, will be teaching our 5th grade Family Living classes again this year. The classes will begin the last week of February and continue throughout March.. The Family Living classes are designed to help children learn about growth and development, including the changes of adolescence. The material is family centered and parents play an important and natural role in making the course meaningful for their own children.
