Worker's Permit Information (Optional)

Students age 14 or older require a worker's permit for employment. This can be obtained in the NHS School Counseling Office. ***A parent must be present with a copy of the student's birth certificate, passport, or driver's license.*** Office hours are from 7:00 AM – 3:00 PM.

Driver Education Information (Optional)

Driver Education is NOT a requirement for graduation; however, it is strongly recommended. Students typically take this course in their sophomore year. It is worth .25 credit, and it is offered in the fall semester, every other day. Once students obtain their Driver Permit, they are eligible to participate in the optional Behind-The-Wheel Program (additional fee). More info can be found on the NHS website.

Cumberland Perry Area Vocational Technical School (Optional; Application Required)

Students interested in attending CPAVTS should let their school counselor know as soon as possible so that proper course planning can occur. Students traditionally apply for attendance in the fall of their freshman year to attend during through 10th-12th grade years!
