- description of each attraction (minimum of 3 sentences)
- photo/map of each attraction

Inside Center flap:

- History of your state
- Be sure to include how your state became a state, historical events that have taken place in your state such as natural disasters, wars, etc. (2 paragraphs)

Inside right flap:

- Entertainment Highlight- highlight a popular singer, sports team, vacation destination, actor or actress that is specific to your state. (MUST BE DIFFERENT FROM YOUR ATTRACTIONS FLAP)

Back Right Flap:

- State symbols (5)
- State flag

Back Center flap:

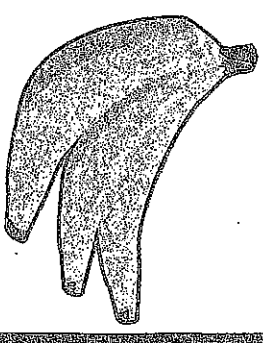

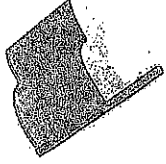
