





Important NES Reminders

Notice of Early Pick-Up

Parents, please help our Cafeteria Staff in maintaining accurate Lunch Counts. If your child will be dismissed for an appointment prior to lunch and/or if you are planning to bring lunch in for your child, please alert the school by sending in a notice indicating early dismissal, or call ahead for lunch visit. That way, our teachers will know not to order a lunch for your child. We greatly appreciate your help with this matter.



Northern York County School District Pre-Arranged Absence Form Dear Families: As you make plans for your child to miss school for a pre-arranged activity please understand that teachers will be preparing assignments for your child to complete during his/her absence from school. It is very important that your child complete these assignments before returning to school so that he/she will be prepared to proceed with the class. The teachers will make every effort to review materials your child missed. However, it is very difficult for a student to make up work missed and complete new assignments upon their return to school. Many of the activities, experiences and discussions they missed cannot be duplicated. School buildings and districts throughout Pennsylvania, are evaluated on their students' attendance each year. Schools are required by the No Child Left Behind legislation to maintain a daily average attendance of 95%. Pre-arranged absences are averaged in with all other absences in our school's annual report. Therefore, we request that you make every effort to avoid planning trips or appointments during the school day. Please use vacation days and summer months for these activities when possible. We greatly appreciate your help.

Notice of Absences


We thank you for diligently submitting excusal notices within three days of your child's absence. This is a State requirement and your consistency in providing this is essential and appreciated. **Please be sure to use the District Excuse Booklets to indicate absences**. If you are in need of another booklet, alert the office and we will be certain to send another one home.

Unexpected Early Dismissals

Parents, in the event of Early Dismissal due to inclement weather, it is essential that you alert the school office each time—via note, fax, or phone call- if you wish your child to be dropped off at a stop different than their normal bus stop. This is important, as your child will need a bus pass alerting the bus driver of this change. Otherwise, your child will be dropped off at his/her usual bus stop.


