

Sapphire Parent Portal for New Users

New Families to the district are asked to create a Parent/Guardian Portal Account in our Sapphire System. The system will not longer assign a PIN; this will not be required on the new site. Attached you will find directions to create this important account.

Upon completion, this account provides access to your child's school records: class assignment, report cards, attendance information, etc. The Parent Account is a separate account from the Registration Account used to enroll your student.

Sapphire Parent Portal: Updates for Individuals with Accounts prior to August 1, 2021

Our Student Information System, Sapphire is now officially upgraded. The new site is basically redesigned to better accommodate various mobile devices such as tablets, phones, and laptops.

Parents/Guardians who already have an account will need to log in with user name and password. You will be prompted to provide your PIN the first time you login to the new portal. Below you will find a document that reviews the process to complete in order to convert your account to the new portal.

If you do not remember your PIN number, please contact our NES School Office (717-432-8691 x 1500) for assistance. Following this one-time PIN entry, current users will no longer need a PIN.

Start and End of Day

First Day of School

The first day of school for children is **Monday, August 30, 2021**. It is a Cycle Day 1. Our school day starts promptly at 9:00 AM and student entry begins at 8:45 AM.

Please note, students *may not* be dropped off at the school in advance of 8:45 AM. Students *arriving after* 9:00 AM will need to be signed into the *main office*, located in front of Northern Elementary, by the person dropping them off.

Transportation: Bus and Van Information

Time Sensitive Transportation Information: Please be sure to review your child's bus information, posted to the Sapphire Parent Portal. Contact Lynne Wicker at the Transportation Department by calling 717-432-8691 X 1106 or by emailing lwicker@northernyc.org with any changes or concerns. **All requests must be communicated to the Transportation Office by noon on Tuesday, August 16, 2021.**

Reminders from our Transportation Department include:

- Pick up and drop off times are estimated.
- Times and stop locations may need to be adjusted.
- Students are to be out and visible 5 minutes before the bus is expected to arrive and younger students should be accompanied by an adult.
- All changes must be made on the " Change of Information" form and given to the building secretary prior to the start of school.
- Board Policy #810 provides authorization of the use of cameras on school buses, including those that capture video and audio recordings. These cameras monitor the behavior on the bus to ensure that the established bus safety and conduct rules are being followed. Video/Audio cameras will be randomly rotated among all regularly scheduled buses based upon the number of incidents of misconduct.
- The Student Transportation Handbook may be downloaded from the District website at www.northernpolarbears.com/transportation.

Transportation Information:

Information on bus procedures can be found via the video that will be shared next week. It is important to note that at this time, all bus and van riders will be required to wear a mask when using District Transportation, per State Law. Please see our District Opening Plan, included in this week's Smore News.

Students traveling by vans to our school will receive their information via a phone call directly from the assigned van driver. This call also takes place much closer to the start of school. Please contact the transportation office at (717) 432-8691 ext. 1106 with any questions.

We strongly encourage students to ride the school bus to and from school, starting the very first day. This practice will support their success in arrival/dismissal routines. Staff members will be on hand to assist all children in arriving safely to their classrooms.

Please Note:

Northern Elementary is growing. We will likely have an additional 2 buses to our roster. Please anticipate some delay over the first ten days of school as we work to ensure that students are getting on to the correct bus/van, and as drivers get used to their routes.

We still ask that parents be at the bus stop 5 minutes in advance of their child's pick up / drop off times; even though we may likely have some delay.

It is important to remind our families that State Law prevents adults other than the bus driver, students, and district personnel to board buses. Have a question or concern you wish to relay? If it is vital, quick and non-confidential information for the driver, share with them from the stop. If it is vital, lengthy and confidential information, please call into the school and we will follow up on your request or concern.

Thank you in advance of our year. We greatly appreciate your patience and partnership as we work through the logistics of transportation, prioritizing the safety of all student passengers.

Car Rider Drop Off and Pick Up Information

Car Riders

AM Entry to Building: 8:45 AM - 9:00 AM

PM Dismissal to Parents: 3:30 PM - 3:40 PM


Our car rider loop is located in the back of Northern Elementary, between the High School and Northern Elementary. Vehicles should enter via Middle School drive, turn left onto Polar Bear Drive and turn right to the Drop Off/Pick Up Zone.

Vehicles are required to move forward to the very end of the line, closest to the High School, assisting us in keeping the line of traffic flowing. It is important that vehicles stay on the left side of the yellow line. Students should be released via the passenger side and only when the vehicle is within the yellow lined zone. Parents remain in their vehicles, as Northern Elementary staff will support student entry into the building.


Please ensure that your child is packed and ready for exit upon entering the car rider line. It is important that the flow of this line remains expedient and safe, permitting both exit and entry within the time allotted for this service.

If your child will be a **daily** parent pick up or an **occasional** parent pick up, the car rider dismissal registration form on our website will need to be filled out. This form will allow you to register for a tag for the car pick up line. Please visit www.northernpolarbears.com/nes and select the "Car Rider Registration Form" and complete the required information. The form can be additionally accessed [here](#). A three day turnaround from completion to available tag is necessary.

School Breakfast and Lunch Information

Our school cafeteria will provide students breakfast and lunch for the 2021-2022 school year. We are pleased to relay that the District is participating in the Seamless Summer Option, providing students enrolled to receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch each school day, at no cost to the household.

MyPaymentsPlus Online Account

Although no further action is required from you, if you wish to open a MyPaymentsPlus account for your child, please visit www.mypaymentsplus.com. MyPaymentsPlus, a convenient, easy and secure online prepayment service, allows parents to deposit money into a school meal account and provides parents the ability to view account balances, add funds electronically, and view what is purchased each day. Parents can also sign up to receive an email when a low fund balance occurs. Parents/Guardians may forgo opening such an account this year.

Free and Reduced Priced Meals

Additionally, households who may qualify for Free or Reduced priced meals are strongly encouraged to complete a Free and Reduced Priced Meal Application (below). This is important as families that apply for and are approved for free or reduced priced meals may be eligible for additional discounts or approved benefits. Again, although no further action is needed for children to participate in the meal programs without paying a fee or submitting an application, families are encouraged to complete and return a new application by October 12, 2021. Please see more information on whether your family meets the criteria outlined below.

Breakfast and Lunch Menus

Menus are available online by visiting the district webpage: www.northernpolarbears.com and selecting the lunch bag/apple icon. Additional information regarding the school lunch program can also be found at the Food Services section of our website.

Sunshine Cafe Seating

Students will sit by classroom cohort, spaced as feasibly able within the cafeteria. Our lunchtime routines are supported by school staff in each lunch period. The yellow table in the cafe, our Sunshine Table, serves to support allergy free eaters. Students with allergy restrictions sit at this table, with peers eating the District meals that day. This ensures a nut and peanut free experience for all seated at the table. This table is disinfected with "Sunshine Table Only" materials.

Sunshine Cafe Climate

The climate in the cafeteria seeks to ensure the safety and security of all our students. Once seated, students engage in conversation with the peers at their cohort table and are supported with accessing condiments, forgotten utensils, etc by school staff. A touchless water bottle station is located just outside the cafe and students are permitted access to this water source. Our safety procedures for communication and attention to cafe volume is, "Lights off, Voices off." This signal is used to ensure silence for important directions and/or safety alerts.

Students are celebrated, classroom cohorts are spotlighted, and fun events are previewed as a part of the Sunshine Cafe experience. Each classroom cohort has 30 minutes in the Sunshine

Cafe.

2021-2022 Lunch Schedule

It is important to note that we cannot accommodate visitors in the Sunshine Cafe. With space capacity and safety in mind, we encourage families to avoid requesting visitation during this time. It's particularly fun to see our packers, open love notes from families during lunchtime! Oftentimes, our staff reads the notes to students as a part of their individual requests. Feel free to slip a note of encouragement into your child's lunchbox or backpack and stay tuned for PTO fundraising initiatives that further celebrate your student during this time.

Lunch Packer Reminders

Although free meals will be provided by the District this year, students may choose to pack their lunch each day. These lunches should be nutritional. Sodas are not permitted as part of the lunchtime experience and the school does not have cooling or heating opportunities for meals. Please pack items that require a cool climate, with an icepack and items that require heating, in a thermos. We additionally ask families to refrain from packing meals in glass containers.

School Supplies

Basic school supplies are provided to your child by the district and students do not need to bring materials from home. Students are welcome to bring their own book bag and lunch box from home.

Personal Items

Students are reminded to leave toys and other valuable items at home. Students are not permitted to swap or exchange personal items at school.

Birthdays

Students are celebrated via school-wide recognition and classroom tradition (e.g. song, sticker, crown, etc.) on their birthdays. Snacks and treats from home are not permitted for classroom celebration. The PTO additionally celebrates students in their birthday month via

the Birthday Books Program, inviting students to select a brand new book for their personal library!


Katie Benfer - Grade 2
