Student Drop Off Reminder

Students may not be dropped off at the front curb between 8:30 AM-9:00 AM. During this time we have buses and vans that require ample space to unload students in a safe manner. Student Absences- Absence Policy

Please remit doctor excuses to the school office within three days of your child's absence. Without these essential documents, your child's absence is entered as unlawful in our system. The easiest method is to request a doctor's excuse the same day you visit the doctor and provide to school office upon your return. Please utilize the Northern York County School District excusal forms along with the physician's excuse.

Spring Attire ... It's that time of year!

As we enter our spring months, students are reminded to follow our dress code of suitable footwear for outside play; lighter clothing that covers the shoulders and shorts and skirts must be of an appropriate length. Please refrain from wearing sandals or flip-flops, as this prevents our students from participating in active play at recess.

Student Rosters – Class Requests

Please know that the process of assigning students to homerooms comes with great consideration and planning. Our school team makes note of academic, social and behavioral strengths and needs. The process is a balance of student data performance and looking at the whole child. As a result, the guidance counselor and building specialists will review roster recommendations and provide expert input. I am an integral part of the process and meet with grade levels, review rosters and make adjustments based on what's best for our students. We value your input as parents and the information you provide on the particular learning style of your student is welcomed. If you feel there is something we should know about your child, that we do not already know, please put that in a letter addressed to J. Cal. We will attempt to honor requests for particular teaching styles, however please be mindful that classroom assignments will be made with best interest of all children, including your child. Therefore, a request does not ensure, immediate assignment. We are fortunate to have a dedicated staff of qualified instructors, all with unique strengths that benefit our children. Please note, written requests are required by May 7th.

Band Program Receives Mini-Grant I The Northern elementary band program has received a mini-grant from the Polar Bear Foundation.

Mr. Nebistinsky, elementary band director, wrote a proposal for the creation of a Rhythm Coach lab. This lab is a new and exciting tool for teaching and practicing percussion. It is comprised of three rhythm coaches, headphones, cords and speakers. At the center of the lab is the Roland RMP-5 Rhythm Coach, which is a sophisticated metronome and practice instrument with many functions to help teach rhythm to beginning percussion students. It also features special coaching functions that assist students in playing music correctly and accurately. Students have fun, while learning to play in time, both alone and together. Using the lab helps students improve their performance quicker and use their time efficiently. Mr. Nebistinsky as developed innovative techniques for it's use. This is another way that the Northern music department is using effective technology to improve student learning and performance.
