### ALERT! Parent Drop Offs and Pick Ups...

**PLEASE park and escort your child across the parking lot** when dropping off or picking up a student. This is extremely important during the hours of 8:15-9:15 AM and 3:15-4:15 PM. Since our buses and vans arrive at various times within these hours and it is essential that these lanes remain clear. As a result, cars may not use this lane to stop and unload students. We greatly appreciate your support and assistance in keeping our students safe.

Please note that students dropped off between 8:35 AM and 8:45 AM should report to the Gymnasium via the outside Purple Gym Doors. Additionally, at the end of the day, Parent Pick-Ups will be dismissed from the Gymnasium Doors following proper identification by NES staff. 
#### Northern York County School District Pre-Arranged Absence Form

Dear Families:

As you make plans for your child to miss school for a pre-arranged activity please understand that teachers will be preparing assignments for your child to complete during his/her absence from school. It is very important that your child complete these assignments before returning to school so that he/she will be prepared to proceed with the class. The teachers will make every effort to review materials your child missed. However, it is very difficult for a student to make up work missed and complete new assignments upon their return to school. Many of the activities, experiences and discussions they missed cannot be duplicated.

School buildings and districts throughout Pennsylvania, are evaluated on their students' attendance each year. Schools are required by the No Child Left Behind legislation to maintain a daily average attendance of 95%. Pre-arranged absences are averaged in with all other absences in our school's annual report. Therefore, we request that you make every effort to avoid planning trips or appointments during the school day. Please use vacation days and summer months for these activities when possible. We greatly appreciate your help.



### **MENU INFORMATION**

Menu's may be accessed via the Northern Website under the "**Quick Links**" section on the District Homepage or a printable copy may be found under the "**Our District**" tab located on the main webpage

Under the "Our District" tab is a link for Food Service. Under this link parents/guardians may access information, in addition to the menu, regarding Free and Reduced Price lunches and Mealpay Plus.

All students use the District's Point of Sale (POS) system for breakfast, lunch and milk sales. Every student uses his/her student ID number assigned to them as their POS pin number. It is extremely important that students memorize their pin numbers. Parents this makes for a fun travel activity!

Please remember to send money (in a sealed envelope labeled with your child's name and POS number) to be applied to your student's account. Payments may be made at the school or on-line via MealpayPlus. More information on MealpayPlus may be found on the District website as mentioned above. MealpayPlus is at no charge for parents <u>unless</u> you choose to make payments on-line or via telephone at 1-866-691-2116. All other MealpayPlus services are at no charge.

### **CHARGING LUNCHES**

Parents are encouraged to keep all student account balances current and in good standing. If it should happen that a student does not have monies available to pay for lunch, the student will be allowed to charge a meal and these charges will be added to the balance of the student's account.

Outstanding balance letters are sent home on a regular basis and parents are encouraged to bring all outstanding balances current promptly. Unless payment arrangements are made or paid in full, unresolved outstanding balances will be sent on for further collection procedures
