

How Credits are Earned

- 60% or higher final average needed to earn credit.
- Currently, quarter grades are worth 40% each and the semester exam is worth 20% when calculating semester averages.
- GPA and class rank are calculated at the end of each semester.
- English and Math are courses that should not be doubled up in one academic year to "recover" credit. A student should make it up in summer school to stay on track for graduation.

- Your grade level and homeroom placement is determined by the number of years you have been enrolled in high school.
- Having senior status and being in a senior homeroom does not guarantee you will graduate with your class. You must meet all curriculum and testing requirements.
- We don't plan to fail, we just fail to plan. Plan to succeed!!

The Bottom Line: How to be on Track to Graduate

- One year = Two Semesters. 7 class periods in a day
- Full year classes: 2 semesters = 1 credit
- Semester classes = 1/2 credit
 Except PE I / II which is 1/4 credit per semester
- Must have English, Science, Math, Social Studies in your freshman year schedule (sophomore & junior years too)
- Recommended to take Health/PE, Elective, Study Hall
- Study Halls are **encouraged** for freshmen but not required; only 1 study hall is allowed per semester
- Pass/earn credit for the classes you take each year
- BARRIERS TO SUCCESS ARE POOR ATTENDANCE AND NOT DOING HOMEWORK.

Springfield-Clark Career Technology Center

- <u>CTC</u> available for the junior and/or senior year.
- Primary goal to assist students in obtaining skills that will allow for them to enter the job market or pursue further training in colleges, universities, or technical schools.
- Acceptance criteria includes attendance, behavior & grades/credits earned.
- Health/P.E./Fine Arts/Foreign Language are not available at CTC. Career-Tech Honors Diploma criteria requires two years of the same foreign language.
- CTC schedule allows for only 3-4 academic courses each year so there is no time during the school day to retake a class that was previous failed.

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

- Opportunity to receive college credit while in high school.
- Attend the informational meeting each year; the powerpoints from this year's meeting are available on the KR website. Need to watch both of them.
- Student must submit "Intent to Participate" form by April 1 AND meet college admission criteria (including admission testing) and be accepted for enrollment by the college.
- For more information about the CCP program, attend the informational meeting or see KR website.
