Nutrition Services-Points of Pride

- Healthy e-Living
- Continue to be a "Go-to" District for best practices and healthy menu planning/ideas
- Federal and State compliant in all areas with a highly successful
 Federal Audit completed October 2014
- Menus have evolved and will continue to include new items that support the My Plate concept and feature more plant based foods and healthy options
- Implementation of Dietetic Intern Program (RD) in collaboration with ASU and Maricopa County Dept. of Public Health
- Increased breakfast participation to support learning in the classroom
- Continuation of parent outreach
- Dining Expose held at Parent University
- Parent outreach regarding "Smart Snacks"



Counseling, Psychological, & Social Services-Points of Pride

- Hosted 5th Annual *Mental Health* Expo with increase participants and valley partners (from 22 to 29 partners)
- Safe and Supportive Schools—obtained Multi-Tiered Systems of Support specific to behavior study/grant (MTSS-B) for 15/16 and 16/17.
 - Currently 23 PBIS schools
 - Training and support for 5 more elementary via MTSS-B study
- Expansion of Tier 2/Tier 3 behavioral interventions
