No Pass/No Play

- Currently implemented for Middle School and High School Athletics
- Reinforce application of No Pass/No Play to Middle School and High School Activities
- Ensure continuity of language in Code of Conduct, Athletic Code of Conduct and Handbooks

No Pass/No Play (High School)

 Pursuant to Arizona's No Pass No Play Rule, a student athlete must have received passing grades in all classes during the previous grading period (including summer school) in order to be eligible for the upcoming athletic season.

No Pass/No Play (Middle School)

ACADEMIC ELIGIBLILTY (NO PASS-NO PLAY)

• A student shall have received a passing grade in all classes during the previous grading period to compete in any extracurricular games. This includes tournament games and the competitive games. In order to be eligible to compete in middle school athletic competition, students must have a grade of "D" or better in all assigned classes including elective coursework.

Grade Checks

 Current grades will be collected on the fourth Monday of each season. Students with an "F" or an "I" will not be eligible to play in the tournament games or the competitive games until a passing grade is verified in writing for the class (es) in question.

No Pass/No Play (Participate): Benefits for Students

- Opportunity for student-school engagement
- Coach (adult) mentoring and guidance
- Academic monitoring and supports (i.e., coaches study hall, before school tutoring, etc.)

No Pass/No Play (Participate): Next Steps

- Use Student Information System to identify student in athletics and activities for future data-based decision making
- Look at random sample by school, sport/activity current reality academic achievement
- Reinforce coach/sponsor expectations to identify and provide athletes/students in need of academic supports (i.e. grade checks)

Mandatory ID's (MS/HS)

• During the school day, all middle and high school students are required (when feasible) to wear their school identification in such a manner that it is clearly visible at all times.....Students must be in possession of their identification card at all school related functions (e.g., dances, activities, and athletics.) School identification is required to ride the school bus, purchase food in the cafeteria, check out library books, and access an account at the bookstore.


Mandatory ID's (ES)


 Elementary students will be required to have their student ID to ride the bus and may wear their school identification at certain times throughout the day as deemed appropriate based on grade level, nature of the activity, etc. School identification may also be used to purchase food in the cafeteria and check out a library book.


Bullying


- Language that mandates student and parent participation in diversion program specific to offenders of Bullying
- Language to include consequences for "repeat" offenders

Recommendations

- Approval of the 2012/2013 Code of Conduct specific to:
 - Requirement of Student ID's
 - Bullying language additions including "cyber" bullying
 - Mandatory diversion program for offenders of Bullying incidences (Social Responsibility Training) and language for repeat offenders
 - Technology Use Agreement—addition of BYOT and eLearning language
 - Student rights--Addition of "electronic" correspondence
 - Length of knife—1.5 inch recommendation of formal disciplinary hearing
