

Message From the Principal: Dr. Breon

Our Mill Hall Elementary Wildcats have had a great month of learning while building in some fun, as well. celebrated our students success with a Board Games PBIS (Positive Behavior Supports and Interventions) Reward for the month; and kicked off Read Across America with some guests from the CMHS Student Athlete Leadership members. Our staff also welcomed over 45 children for our 2024-25 Kindergarten Class. There were a lot of smiles for the Class of 2037!

Mill Hall Elementary has seen an increase in the number of student absences this school year. Please know your child is missed every day that they are not in school, and they miss key instructional opportunities that when accumulated can have a detrimental impact on their growth as a learner. While we recognize occasional absences are necessary for illnesses and appointments, we encourage you to help us continue to grow your child(ren) through regular attendance. The Attendance Regulations from our Keystone Central Elementary Student Handbooks is copied below:

ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS

There is a direct and positive correlation between regular school attendance and achievement. Students and families are encouraged to avoid any unnecessary absence from school.

- Examples of excused absences include: illness, death in the family, medical or dental appointments, required court appearance, unavoidable family emergencies, or other 'urgent' reasons such as impassable roads.
- Funeral absences: local funeral = 1 day excused; out of town funeral = up to 3 days excused; exception includes immediate family member = 5 days excused absence

- Examples of unexcused absences include oversleeping, car issues, missing bus, hunting, shopping.
- Excuses can be emailed to:
 - Mill Hall Elem <u>mhattendance@kcsd.us</u>
- When a student is tardy to school, they will be expected to turn in a note. Their tardy absences will be marked as unlawful/unexcused if there is no excuse turned in to the attendance office by the third (3rd) day following the absences. For example, if your student is absent on Monday, you MUST send in an excuse for that absence by Thursday of that week or it will be marked as an unlawful/unexcused absence. Excuses may be questioned or refused if not signed by the parent, legal guardian, or physician.
- You will receive a letter when your child has 3 unlawful days. The letter will contain information about a School Attendance Improvement Conference (SAIC) to assist with regular school attendance. The school counselor will contact Children and Youth's truancy outreach worker and the KCSD attendance officer will be notified.
- When your child has **6 unlawful** days, the KCSD attendance officer may file a citation with the magisterial district judge and your student will be formally referred to Children and Youth.
- After your child is absent for **10 days** (parental excuse days) you will receive a letter informing you that your child has reached 10 days. After this, you MUST turn in a physician's excuse for every absence for the rest of the school year.

Title I funds follow the students. When our students attend a nonpublic school, our school funds are allocated on a per pupil basis to the nonpublic school to support any students who have an academic need who would have attended a KCSD school. We work with our nonpublic schools to help support our students, because no matter where they attend, students who reside within the boundaries of KCSD are our students.

Title II funds are designed to support the teachers. We use Title II funds for professional development in areas such as mathematics, English/Language Arts, and social-emotional learning.

At all school levels, we use Title IV federal funds to purchase incentives for PBIS (our positive school-wide behavior supports) rewards, and we emphasize the goal of following school rules in all schools.



I also wanted to give a spotlight to a great book about confidence.




