AIMS is a way we support students in interacting with others and self identify key components of themselves. An increase of some unique student behaviors are being noticed. From asking peers on dates and flirting to wearing 'Cookie' or 'Pure Blanco' attire - it all seems innocent enough-ish. Dating and flirting are typically innocent behaviors, but when it's preventing our students to focus on learning (because they are the uncomfortable recipients OR they are the overfocused student with feelings) it's time we involve ourselves and support conversations with students that at this age their focus needs to be on how to be a good community member and a good friend, while explaining (when appropriate) deeper relationships are more appropriate when they are older. 'Cookies' is a cannabis company and 'Pure Blanco' is from a company that promotes cocaine. Please help our students represent themselves as strong learners, ready to maximize their opportunities at school. If students are wearing these items, or others that go against our District Dress Code staff are being guided to notify administration so we can provide a change of clothes and/or contacting parents.
