

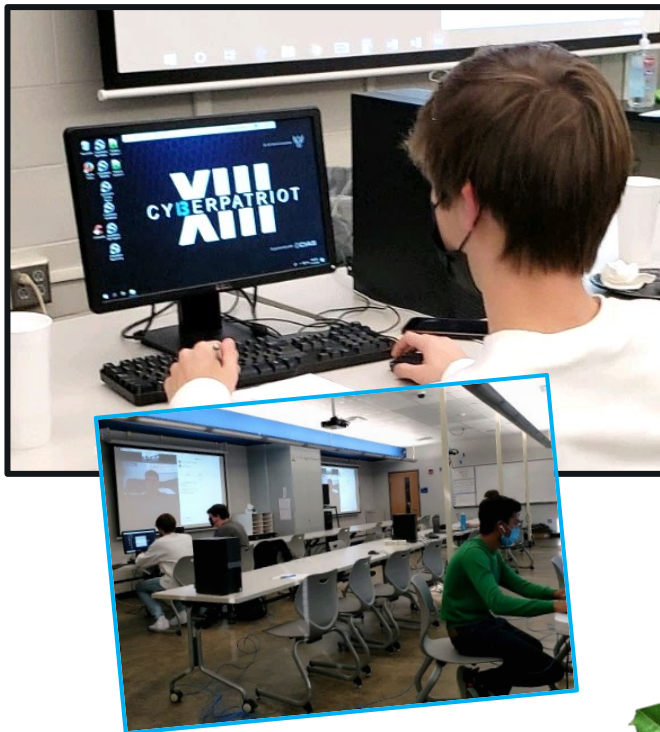

The 2020-21 CyberPatriot team had its first competition on the evening of Friday, November 13. Six IT students comprise the team: three returning students - Michael Reisinger, Rishi Rao, and Jiaxuan Wang, and three new members - Jeff Hess, Adam Lockhart, and Kaushal Padmanabhan.

This year brought new complications: two students, as well as coach Michael Paprocki (PLTW Computer Science, Cybersecurity & Networking teacher), had to participate virtually. C⁴ Business teacher Bob Hartman graciously stepped in as an alternate coach, to be present during the competition.

Even with the new challenges, the team performed well. During this round, the team improved on their score from last year, with 251 out of 300 points. They finished 7th out of 24 in the state and 728th out of 2834 overall. The next competition is on Dec. 11. The average of these two rounds will place the team in its tier - Platinum, Gold, or Silver.
