\*\*\* **SY22-23 Council Initiatives:** Begin discussions to determine the focus of the council's upcoming work. Lean on our school's Semester Action Plan to ensure the work of the council is aligned with the goals and initiatives being targeted by the school leaders. Council is tasked with prioritizing 1 – 2 initiatives the SGC could lead or support throughout the year.

#### Charter Dollars

We are very happy to share that Fulton leaders made the decision to allocate all Charter Dollars afforded to us by the State equally across our School Governance Councils. All schools should have received \$46,390 in funds to help them meet their strategic goals and support local initiatives for this coming school year. Each Charter Dollar expenditure requires a council vote for approval, the completion of the [Charter Dollar Expenditure Form](#), and is subject to the same district guidelines that govern school cost center budgets. In addition, district leaders have asked that all councils pause on purchases related to safety and security until expenditure guidelines in these fields are shared with SGCs and school leaders. Finally, all Charter Dollars must be spent in the year in which they are received as they are intended to support our current student population, thus we encourage councils to start scheduling discussions to plan for these expenditures as a way to ensure

that all purchases are made prior to spending deadlines near the end of the school year. See our  [Charter Dollar Matrix](#) for examples of FCS supported expenditures.

### **Semester Action Plans**

As our district and school-level strategic plans have officially come to the end of their term, councils should utilize the goals and initiatives in their school's Semester Action Plans to guide the work of the council. This fall, principals will share these plans with the council and throughout the year will provide progress updates as well as address any changes that need to be made to the plan. As Semester Action Plans are created by the principal, they will not require a council vote for approval. They should, however, help SGCs prioritize and determine their areas of focus until the district shares information/timelines related to the development of a new district or school-level plans.
