Online Registration

Each summer, all families complete online registration for each enrolling child. This ensures we have updated information, allows parents to complete all annual forms, and provides access to meal and registration payments from the comfort of home.

Even if your child participated in Kindergarten Round-Up, you must register them during online registration.

Online registration is completed through Skyward, our student management system. **Online** registration will be open July 24-29, 2024. Families who need help completing the registration process may visit Southwood Elementary on Monday, July 29 between 10:00 AM - 6:00 PM.



Skyward

Get to know our online student management system, known as Skyward. You will use Skyward for annual registrations and adding money to your student's meal account. Access Skyward through the Southwood Current Families Page at southwoodel.msdwc.org/family.



Preparation Skills



The transition to kindergarten is respected as a major milestone not only for the child, but for their family as well. The attitude towards school and learning that the child carries with them for life is often determined by this very first experience with school. A smooth transition to kindergarten can help make sure your child is successful in school.

This list of skills is meant to help you prepare your child for their Kindergarten experience.



Special Education

Southwood Elementary School is an inclusive public school that welcomes students with a variety of learning styles, special circumstances, and diverse needs. Our team of teachers work collaboratively to ensure the best possible learning experience. By working together as a multidisciplinary team, we can create an individualized education program that meets the needs of all students. Through the Wabash-Miami Area Program, we are able to utilize services from School Psychologists, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech and Language Pathologists, a Deaf and Hard of Hearing Teacher, as well as a Blind Low Vision Teacher.

Whether your student has been identified as having significant learning difficulties or you have concerns regarding your student's achievement, our special education team can meet with you to discuss a plan of action that supports your child in their least restrictive environment. An educational evaluation may be conducted for students suspected to have a disability that impacts their educational performance. To learn more about our program and services, please contact the school office to schedule an appointment.



Summer Learning

MSDWC believes in the importance of learning outside the classroom. Each summer, the district offers students various travel opportunities. SES Kindergarteners can join Minds In Action (MIA) Level 1. This three-day experience takes students to places in northeast Indiana such as the Fort Wayne Zoo, a local creek stomp, and even camping at Salamonie State Park. MIA sign up information is typically announced during the winter.



School Days

Traveling to School

Families can choose to have their children ride the school bus to and from school, or they can bring and pick them up.

Official Start Time - 8:25 AM



Students may begin arriving to school as early as 7:50 AM. The majority of students are present by 8:10 AM. Students who arrive at these earlier times are able to eat breakfast before class begins.

Official End Time - 3:00 PM

Students who are picked up are dismissed from class at 2:53 PM. Students riding the school bus will then be dismissed. Buses typically leave the parking lot by 3:05 PM.



What to Wear

Students should wear clothing that is appropriate for the current weather. Closed-toe shoes are encouraged for recess play, and tennis shoes are required for P.E. class.

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
BUS ARRANGEMENTS

During online registration, parents will complete a transportation survey indicating where their child will need picked up and dropped off. Before the start of the school year, your child's bus driver will contact you to confirm your transportation plans. During this phone call, the bus driver will confirm pick-up and drop-off times. Our drivers must wait until all student registrations have been received before making their route plans, so this phone call might happen just a day or two before the start of school.

RULES FOR BUS RIDING

- Get to the pick-up location at least 5 minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- Have a safe place to wait for your bus, away from traffic and the street.
- Stay back at least 10 feet from the road while waiting for the bus. Do not play games or run around at the bus stop.
- Be aware of the street traffic around you. Drivers of other vehicles are required to follow specific road rules concerning school buses; however, not all do.
- When you see the bus coming, form a line do not rush to the roadway or push others to try to be the first on the bus.
- If you must cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the sidewalk or along the side of the road to a point at least five giant steps (10 feet) ahead of the bus before you cross. Be sure that the bus driver can see you, and you can see the bus driver.
- Wait until the driver motions for you to cross. Wait until the bus stops, the door opens, and the driver says it is okay before stepping onto the bus.
- Use the handrails to avoid falls. When exiting the bus, be careful that clothing with drawstrings and book bags with straps are not caught in the handrails or doors.
- NEVER walk behind the bus!
- Keep items in a backpack or bag. Do not try to pick up something dropped near the bus—the bus driver may not see you. Ask the driver first.
- Respect others' property at the bus stop and on the bus.
- When being dropped off, exit the bus and walk ten giant steps away from the bus before pausing.

CAR RIDERS ARRIVAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Arrival begins at 7:50 AM. Do not drop off any students before this time. We will not have supervision available.
- 2. Please do not arrive early and park along the sidewalk to wait for 7:50 AM. This creates a dangerous situation as our cars will eventually back up and stop traffic on the highway. If you arrive early, park in the parking lot near the softball diamond (west side) and wait. Please do not park along the west sidewalk. That sidewalk area is reserved for Little Knights drop-off only. If you do park, once you see staff going to the sidewalk to greet cars, either walk your student to the sidewalk or circle back to the entrance and get in the line forming in our drop-off lane.
- 3. Please ensure that your student(s) is/are ready to exit the vehicle promptly with all needed materials when the vehicle comes to a stop. This will make for a quick exit and keep our traffic flowing.
- 4. Students should exit the vehicle on the side closest to the sidewalk.
- 5. When exiting the drop-off lane, check for pedestrians and other vehicles before you proceed.
- 6. Students arriving from 7:50-8:05 AM will report to the cafeteria.
- 7. Those car riders who need breakfast will report directly to the cafeteria to begin eating as soon as they arrive. Breakfast service begins at 7:50 AM.
- 8. Students are considered tardy if they are not in their seats, ready to begin the day at 8:25 AM.



CAR RIDERS DISMISSAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Parents walking up to the doors for pick-up will not be admitted into the building. Dismissal will begin at 2:55 PM. Grades K-5 will be dismissed at the main entrance (door #1), and Little Knights and their siblings will be dismissed at the west entrance (door #12). Car riders will be waiting near their entrance with adult supervision.
- 2. Please park in the parent parking lot and walk to your child's pick-up entrance.
- 3. If your child's pick-up location is at the main entrance, you may park along the front sidewalk east of the main door if there is room. **DO NOT BLOCK THE BUS ENTRANCE!**
- 4. Handicapped individuals who need special assistance at dismissal need to call the office and make arrangements. Please wait until 3:10 PM to arrive, as most of our pick-up traffic will be gone, making it easier for you.
- 5. Parents (or the adult approved for pick-up) will be greeted by a staff member.
- 6. Identify yourself to the staff member and tell them whom you are picking up.

7. Have your photo ID available.

- 8. The staff member will tell the inside supervisor that your child is ready for pickup.
- 9. Parents should stand away from the doors and other families so the children can safely exit the building and find their adult.
- 10. To optimize parking spaces, promptly exit the parking lot after picking up your student(s).
- 11. Please do not feel like you must pick up right at 2:55 PM. If some parents choose to wait until closer to 3:05-3:10 PM, it will help avoid congestion.
- 12. Children who are not picked up by 3:15 PM will move to the office, and the adult picking up will need to ring into the office to get them.
- 13. Please remember that the school office closes at 3:30 PM.

School Supplies



Usually available in May, the SES school supplies list will be posted on the SES Families page at **southwoodel.msdwc.org/family**. An email with school supply information will also be sent to families. Supplies can be brought to the Backto-School event, which is typically scheduled a couple of days before the start of the school year. This ensures that students have everything they need from the very start.

Student iPads

Our school district is a one-to-one district, which means each student is provided with an electronic device to assist their learning. Our students currently have iPads, which will be distributed during the first weeks of school. It is very important to help your child take care of their iPad and fully charge it each evening at home.



School Meals

Breakfast and lunch are available to all students through our Food Service Department. Families may choose to eat the school lunch or pack their own lunch. Monthly menus are sent home with each studen and posted on the website. Students may choose between the main meal option each day or a peanut butter and jelly sandwich. The price for meals is typically established during the summer. Price information will be available at msdwc.org/services/food.



Once in Skyward:

Free & Reduced Meals

Families may qualify for free or reduced meal prices based on their income and household size. Be sure to check the current federal eligibility guidelines to see if your family qualifies. If you qualify, it is very important to complete the Free & Reduced Application during student registration. Applying could also help with the cost of textbooks and it gives the school district important reporting data. **Please apply if you qualify.**



Health Policies



When to Stay Home

Students should be kept home when they cannot participate in the classroom. Symptoms that would prevent this would be fever, diarrhea, vomiting, eye drainage, communicable illness, etc. Students should be fever-free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medication before returning to school.

Medicine at School

If it is necessary to give medication at school either daily or as needed, a parent's signature is required. Forms are available at school. All medication must be in the small original bottle with label instructions and transported by an adult.

Screenings

The Indiana State Department of Health requires vision screening in grades K, 1, 3, 5, & 8. Nurses will also do any vision referrals. Hearing screens are done by Wabash-Miami Area Program staff in grades K, 1, 4,



Absence

If a student is not physically present in school, they are absent. There are two kinds of absences: excused and unexcused. Excused absences include:

Reporting an Absence

Call the school office at 260-569-6859 by 9:00 AM on the same day as the absence. Be sure to state the reason for the absence. Voicemail is available 24 hours a day. Email will NOT be accepted since we cannot verify the sender. Late arrivals/early dismissals should be called by 9:00 AM. Failure to notify the school or the lack of a legitimate excuse will result in an unexcused absence.

Appointment Confirmation Statement

When students miss school for an appointment, an official statement from the appointment should be turned in to the school office for the absence to be excused. Please request these from the doctor, dentist, or other provider before returning to school.

Tardy

Students reporting late to school are tardy. Tardy students must stop in the school office for clearance before proceeding to class.

Immunizations

Students must meet the immunization requirements outlined by the Indiana Department of Health. Parents must provide immunization record documents to the school. Documentation may include:

- Records from a healthcare provider
- Immunization record from another school or corporation
- Immunization record in CHIRP Indiana's immunization registry
- Printed record from another state registry

The documentation must include the date (month/day/year) for each dose of vaccine administered. In addition, we recommend students complete a physical and dental exam.

Delays & Cancellations



When school must be delayed or canceled, you will be notified by an automated call and text message. Your contact information in Skyward will be used for these notifications. It is your responsibility to ensure this information is up-to-date.

- On a normal day, it will be announced by 6:30 AM if we are delaying and/or closing.
- Following a delay, it will be announced by 8:30 AM if schools will be closing.
- Automated phone and email contacts are sent within 15 minutes of a delay and/or cancellation.
- Delays, cancellations, and/or early dismissals will also be communicated via the school and district websites, along with Facebook and Twitter.

School Safety

Locked Doors

All exterior and interior classroom doors are locked at all times at Southwood Elementary. This policy ensures an extra layer of security, and follows the best practices for school safety.

Emergency Drills

Southwood conducts monthly fire drills, one severe weather drill, and one lockdown drill per semester. We partner with local first responders, who are often present during these drills.

Safety Specialist

Safety Specialists are school staff members who have yearly training in school safety. They lead emergency drills and provide guidance to other staff in emergency situations. Southwood Elementary exceeds state requirements by having three School Safety Specialists.

Student Pick-Up Policy

During student registration, the guardian will list the adults with permission to pick up the student from school. If someone other than those listed individuals needs to pick up the child, the guardian must notify the school office beforehand. That person must produce a state-issued ID when they pick the student up.

If someone tries to pick up a student without the guardian's permission, the school will not release the child to them, and the guardian will be immediately contacted.

Visitor & Volunteer Screening

Everyone entering Southwood Elementary is checked in using the Raptor Technologies Visitor Management system. Raptor screens all new visitors via their government ID before they can enter. Visitors are then issued a visitor pass that they must return upon their departure.

Volunteers must also submit to and pass a background check before they can volunteer in our schools. Background checks can take up to a week to complete.

Hello. Im Deputy Grant

I am a full-time deputy with the Wabash County Sheriff's Department. When school is in session, I spend my days serving as the School Resource Officer (SRO) for Southwood Elementary.

I have been in law enforcement since 2016, but I also have a bachelor's degree in K-12 physical education. Being an SRO allows me to combine my passion for working with students with my career as a deputy.

I want our students to feel safe in their schools and also give them a positive experience with law enforcement. You will often see me hanging out with students in the lunch room or on the playground as relationship-building is a vital part of my role.

The partnership between MSDWC and the WCSD gives our SROs fantastic training and resources to provide the best school security to our students and staff.

PTO Parent/Teacher Organization

The Southwood Elementary PTO believes that everyone plays a unique role when it comes to the education experience of SES students.

We support students by working in collaboration with teachers on large events such as our annual Read-a-thon and Spring Carnival, and in smaller ways such as providing classroom incentives and fundraiser prizes.


