

Dear Families/Caregivers,

In order to develop social awareness, students must understand that all actions have consequences and their actions and consequences can, and often do, affect others.

In this lesson your child learned to admit when he or she makes mistakes and ways to fix those mistakes. When he or she makes a mistake, it is important to:

- Say Sorry (if it hurt someone else).
- Try to fix the mistake.
- Learn from the mistake.

Here are a few ways you can help your child practice admitting and fixing his or her mistakes:

- Admit to your own mistakes. All of us make mistakes! Show your child the importance of admitting your mistakes and ways that you work to fix your mistakes.
- When your child does make a mistake, calmly remind him or her of the steps to fix a mistake. Help your child practice saying sorry and identifying ways to fix the mistake.
- When reading a book or watching TV together, encourage your child to notice when characters recognize and work to fix their own mistakes.

Learning that actions have consequences, and ways to fix the consequences that hurt others, will help your child become more aware of the impact of his or her choices.
