## Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus

### Lesson 22

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with **phonograms**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

<b>Consonants</b>	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
<b>Vowels</b>	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
<b>Phonograms</b>	A phonogram is a series of letters that represents 1 or more sounds. The vowel sound changes in a phonogram.

Here are some examples of words with phonograms:

<b>ing</b>	<b>ang</b>	<b>ong</b>	<b>ink</b>	<b>ank</b>	<b>onk</b>
bring	bang	dong	blink	bank	bonk
cling	clang	gong	brink	blank	conk
fling	hang	long	drink	sank	clonk
ping	rang	song	sink	thank	honk
ring	sang	strong	think	yank	zonk
