## Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 23

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with **phonograms**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

<b>Consonants</b>	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
<b>Vowels</b>	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
<b>Phonograms</b>	A phonogram is a series of letters that represents 1 or more sounds. The vowel sound changes in a phonogram.

Here are some examples of words with phonograms:

<b>ild</b>	<b>ind</b>	<b>old</b>	<b>olt</b>	<b>ost</b>
child	blind	bold	bolt	host
mild	grind	fold	colt	most
wild	kind	gold	jolt	post

**Your Turn:** This week, be on the lookout for words that have **phonograms**. In the table below, keep a list of pattern words that you read or write with your child.

ild	ind	old	olt	ost
