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Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 30

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with the <u>simple</u> <u>closed-closed multisyllable pattern</u>. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
Simple Closed-Closed Multisyllable	A word with a simple closed-closed multisyllable pattern has 2 syllables and both syllables follow the closed syllable pattern. Each syllable will have 1 vowel sound. There will be 2 consonants between the vowel sounds; we usually divide between them.

Here are some examples of words with the simple closed-closed multisyllable pattern:
