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Grade 1: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 17

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with the <u>long i silent-e</u> <u>syllable pattern</u>. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
Long Vowel Silent-e	Long vowel silent-e words have a single vowel, a single consonant, an e at the end, and the vowel sound is long.

Here are some examples of words with the long i silent-e syllable pattern:
