Grade 2: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 5

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with inflected endings. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
Inflected Endings	Inflected endings affect the meanings of words.

Here are some examples of words with inflected endings:

-s	-es	-ed	-ing
ants	bikes	asked	banging
bugs	bites	begged	going
lips	comes	dozed	making
socks	flies	drifted	walking
steps	scratches	used	yelling
