Grade 2: Weekly Phonics Focus

Lesson 13

In our classroom this week, we are learning to read and spell words with the vowel team **ea**. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z y at the beginning of a word
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u y at the end of a word
Vowel Teams	A vowel team has 2 or more letters side by side that are pronounced as 1 vowel sound. Some vowel teams spelled with 2 letters side by side can be pronounced 2 different ways.

Here are some examples of words with the 2 pronunciations for the vowel team *ea*:

ea <i>(long e as in eagle)</i>		ea <i>(short e as in bread)</i>	
bead	feat	bread	meant
beam	gleam	breath	sweat
beat	heat	dead	threat
each	Jean	head	tread
