## Parent Question Spotlight

One parent asked how their child could take algebra and geometry in MS even though their grades in grade 6 math were not particularly great.

We want students to take the math courses with appropriate challenge. It is more common for students to take Algebra in grade 8 and Geometry in grade 9. This progression puts them on track to maximize our course offerings at ICS with AP Calculus. Quite a few of our families feel they need to accelerate their math progression through taking summer or online programs. As a school we do not recommend this approach as it frequently leaves significant gaps in learning. This is most starkly seen in AP scores of students in grades 11 and 12. Students taking the recommended course pathway (without taking courses outside of ICS) score an average of 4.71 on AP Calculus and Statistics exams. Students who skipped any courses by taking summer/outside work scored an average of 3.49. Additionally, we hear from our math teachers that students who accelerate outside of school have significant gaps and struggle in their courses and end up getting lower academic grades than their peers. AP scores and classroom grades are often heavily utilized by university admissions offices. Please carefully consider any plans to accelerate math progression and speak to your child's math teacher and counselor before making a decision.
