Interviewers asked openended questions to facilitate conversations and evaluated students using a rubric for valuable feedback and scoring for a grade.



Purpose:

- Cadets will demonstrate their proficiency in military drill and ceremony, showcasing skills such as
 precision marching, disciplined movement, and synchronized teamwork, often competing in various
 categories like inspection, regulation drills, and exhibition performances.
- The Drill Team's mission is to represent the United States Military and the Corps of Cadets by
 displaying excellence in the performance art of regulation, exhibition, and individual drill on a local,
 national, and international level. This event serve as a retention tool for cadets to remain in the JROTC
 program, recruiting tool for future Soldiers in the Army and showcase the U.S. Army to the local
 community.

Summary: Richmond Public School's JROTC and the SROTC program at Virginia State University are strategically working together to bridge the gap and rekindle the interest of students in pursuing higher education.
