Athletes in Action

Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity is a global nonprofit housing organization working in local communities across all 50 states in the U.S. and in approximately 70 countries. Habitat's vision is of a world where everyone has a decent place to live. The Habitat for Humanity Club at MHS is a service club that reaches out to the Mahwah community. They raise awareness for the Habitat for Humanity organization by doing service projects, which include shoveling snow for senior citizens, tutoring elementary students, volunteering for the Betsy Ross walkathon, and implementing a training program for the Miles for Marcus Run.
