## SPECIAL PROGRAMS - MULTILINGUAL LEARNERS, SPECIAL EDUCATION, AAP/HIGHLY CAPABLE

### Multilingual Students Receiving ELD Services

- Students should select their required and elective courses on page 1. If they qualify for an ELD English Language Arts course, students will be placed in that course with parent notification. This course will replace the student's grade-level English Language Arts course.
- ELD** is an acronym for English Language Development.

### Students Receiving SPED Services

- Placement for required courses in their qualifying areas will be determined by each student's IEP team. This includes students in our FSA, Mid-Level, and LC programs. Students should register for required courses that are NOT in their qualifying areas. Questions regarding placement can be communicated by your student's case manager or counselor.
- SPED** is an acronym for Special Education.

### Students Receiving AAP/Highly Capable Services:

- Students should select their required and elective courses on page 1. Qualifying students will automatically be placed into AAP/Highly Capable Math and Reading classes based on current year placements or information from the District.
- AAP** is an acronym for Advance Academic Placement.
- Highly Capable Students:**  I have qualified as Highly Capable in Reading.  I have qualified as Highly Capable in Math.
- Parents and Guardians of Highly Capable students:** If your student qualifies for AAP/Highly Capable courses and you prefer that they are NOT enrolled in AAP/Highly Capable courses, please email your student's counselor.
