Classroom Activity/Lesson	Routine Chart	Make a Routine Chart to take home (10-15 minutes) Provide sample routine chart similar to the one below to show students. Here are instructions you can then use with students: 1. Use the poster horizontally to give you the most room for writing. Decide whether you want a Morning Chart, an Evening Chart or both. 2. Under the title for your chart, draw three columns. A large center column plus smaller columns to the left and right. 3. Using the art supplies place sticky side of velcro dots on the right and the left columns and choose decals to attach to the velcro. 4. In the center column, list 3 to 5 actions the student can do in the morning (or evening) to be ready for school each day. Students can then move the decal after they complete each action listed.
