Philip Randolph's School Wide Discipline data from the 2015-16 school year revealed there has been an increase in conduct referrals. Students in grades 4 and 5 had the highest incidents, while kindergarten through third grade student referrals, per grade, stand at or below 8 in total. The most common reason for discipline are <i>classroom</i> <i>disruptions, student battery without injury and battery on</i> <i>employee without injury</i> . Minor percentages from the data report show <i>bullying, technology offenses</i> and <i>battery of</i> <i>student with injury</i> represent less than 1% of the referrals. Studies have shown that school uniforms are a major contributor in building up the feeling of pride amongst students towards their school. Research studies have concluded that students wearing school uniform are more likely to develop a sense of community spirit. Studies have also noted that repeated bullying at school is one of the main reasons why students fall for depression and end up attempting suicide. Bullying can be controlled to a considerable level through implementation of school uniform policy. Students who can not afford expensive or designer clothing are often an easy target to bullying.

<ul> <li>There are several research studies which list the pros and the cons of school uniforms. As we seek to increase positive behavior and attendance rates, the research below associates improved behavior and attendance rates.</li> <li>A study of six big-city Ohio public schools showed students who were required to wear uniforms had improved graduation, behavior and attendance rates. Academic performance was unchanged.</li> <li>The researcher, Virginia Draa of Youngstown State University, said the conclusions were limited by the size of the study.</li> <li>"Uniforms alone do not improve student reading and math proficiency test scores, but they do help in addressing problems with discipline and attendance in a school building."</li> <li>Draa reported that mean graduation rates rose nearly 11 percent at schools that required uniforms, compared to pre-uniform years. Non-uniform school mean graduation rates dropped 4.6 percent, compared with the earlier years.</li> <li>Mean attendance rates at uniform schools increased an average of 3.5 percent in four schools and declined in two. Mean expulsion rates dipped by 0.6 expulsion per 100 students in the years during which uniforms were required.</li> </ul>
