What is TeachTown?

- TeachTown is a suite of special education software that includes an adapted core curriculum as well as supportive interventions for students with disabilities.
- These skills are taught in accessible, achievable steps so that learners can master multi-step tasks one step at a time.

How do we know it works?

- TeachTown's programs utilize research-based practices based on the methodologies of applied behavior analysis (ABA).
- Skills are taught in accessible, achievable steps so that learners can master multi-step tasks one step at a time.
- TeachTown has demonstrated evidence of effectiveness with students with autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disabilities, and developmental disabilities.

Who uses it?

• Students in the following special education program classes will utilize TeachTown: Autism self-contained, Intellectual Disabilities, GNETS (Adapted Curriculum), and Preschool Special Education.

How is it used?

- TeachTown is implemented daily by special education teachers and paraprofessionals using both technology and physical materials.
- TeachTown's instructional technology allows teachers to instruct across a range of devices from the SmartBoard to individual student devices.
