Mew! Personal Finance and Economics Graduation Requirement

In April 2022, Governor Brian Kemp signed into law SB 220, a bill requiring personal finance classes for high school students. The measure "will ensure that [students] learn financial literacy in our schools, like the importance of good credit and how to budget properly so that they can be better prepared for the world beyond the classroom," said Kemp during the signing event.



What is Next Gen Personal Finance?

To support the new high school graduation requirement, Fulton County Schools received the Financial Equity and Empowerment (FEE) Grant funded by the Jordan Brand and Next Gen Personal Finance. Next Gen Personal Finance provides a free blended-learning personal finance curriculum and professional development opportunities for teachers.

NGPF's mission:

By 2030, all U.S. high schoolers will be guaranteed to take at least one semester-long Personal Finance course before graduation
