



REGENTS DIPLOMA

Score 65 or higher on the four Regents exams listed above plus (1) Pathway Option. Students must also earn 22 credits.

LOCAL DIPLOMA

Available for Special Education students who score between 55-64 on the Regents exams using the Low Pass Safety Net. Students must also earn 22 credits. The Local Diploma can also be earned through the Compensatory Safety Net, an appeal or a superintendent's determination. Regular education students may use the Local Diploma option if an appeal is granted by the District for two Regents exams with a score of 60-64 and all remaining Regents exams have a score of 65 or above. Please contact your school counselor for more specific information regarding these options.

ADVANCED REGENTS DIPLOMA

Students must meet all the requirements for a Regents Diploma and then choose one of the four assessment combinations available. The four assessment combinations are: Traditional, Pathway, STEM (Math) and STEM (Science). TRANSPORTATION

CCSD's Transportation Department is responsible for safely transporting over 8,000 students daily to 65 different school locations. CCSD maintains its own fleet of 130 school vehicles. Pupil transportation is the safest form of ground transportation. Per passenger mile traveled, school buses provide the safest form of transportation in the world. Being a school bus driver is something to be proud of! Parents can help by:

- Understanding that there is a dangerous area within 15 feet of all sides of the bus called the danger zone, make sure everyone at the bus stop stays out of the danger zones around the bus.
- Having students wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and the driver opens the door before moving to board the bus.
- Crossing the street correctly. If your child needs to cross the road to get on or off the bus and you meet the bus, cross with your child. Everyone crossing in front of the bus must follow the driver's hand signal
- Avoiding dressing children in traditional yellow raincoats, which blend in with the color of the bus.
- Removing all long jacket and coat drawstrings.
- Being at the bus stop ten minutes before ordinary pickup time.
- Insisting students keep all belongings in a book bag loose items dropped by children can cause them to reach into the danger zone.
- Having children follow the bus driver's safety instructions at all times and reporting bullying to the bus driver, teacher or parent.

OPERATION SAFE STOP

An estimated 50,000 motor vehicles illegally pass New York State school buses every day. Operation Safe Stop seeks to promote school bus safety through education and enforcement efforts. It is illegal to pass a stopped school bus when the red lights located at the top of the bus are flashing. Flashing red lights mean the bus is picking up or dropping off students. You must always stop for the flashing red lights, on divided or multiple lane roads and on school grounds, whether you are approaching the bus head-on or overtaking it.

Electronic cigarette devices can look like a pen, a USB memory drive, a car key fob or even an asthma inhaler. Instead of inhaling tobacco smoke, e-cigarette users inhale vapor from liquid "e-juice" that has been heated with a coil. This is called vaping. The juice is flavored and usually contains nicotine and other chemicals. Some students use these devices to smoke marijuana.

■ YOUNG BRAINS EASILY ADDICTED

E-cigarette aerosol is not harmless "water vapor". The aerosol that users breathe in contains harmful and potentially harmful substances including:

- Nicotine
- Ultrafine particles that can be inhaled deep into the lungs.
- Flavorings such as diacetyl, a chemical linked to lung disease.
- Volatile organic compounds, cancer causing chemicals and heavy metals.

Youth exposure to nicotine is particularly dangerous since it affects developing brain receptors, making them more susceptible to addiction. Nicotine also affects parts of the brain that control attention, learning, mood and impulse control. Youth e-cigarette use has been associated with mental health symptoms such as depression.

■ E-CIGARETTES ARE UNHEALTHY AND ADDICTIVE, YET WILDLY POPULAR AMONG KIDS.

Use of e-cigarettes increased about 1000% from 2019-2020. Flavors and marketing make e-cigarettes appealing to youth.

In 2021, about 1 in every 35 middle school students (2.8%) and 1 in every 9 high school students (11.3%) reported they had used e-cigarettes in the 30 days before the survey.

■ THIS IS QUITTING

Hostage Incident, Kidnapping, Active Shooter

Emergency Communications

Parents will be contacted immediately via phone, email or both by the District. Updates will be sent as available. If an evacuation is required, parents will be notified as to location and transportation arrangements.
