



Annual School Choice Notification

Parent/Guardian Notification of School Choice Privilege Options

In accordance with Effingham County Board of Education policy JBCA Resident Students and Georgia Senate Bill 10 (Special Needs Scholarship), a parent / legal guardian may elect to submit to the Superintendent’s designee a written request that their child(ren) in grades Kindergarten through 12th attend another public school in the Effingham County School System for the 2024-2025 school year.

Applications Open: 8 AM on Monday, March 25, 2024

Applications Close: 4 PM on Friday, April 19, 2024

Who Should Apply

- If your child was approved for transfer in a prior year and your child will be continuing his or her enrollment at the same school, you should **NOT** re-apply.
- If your child will be completing all grades at their current school this academic year and you wish for your child to attend school outside his attendance zone as a rising 6th or 9th grader, you **ARE** required to submit a new application.
- Children not currently attending an Effingham County public school must complete the new student registration process by April 19, 2024 in order to have a School Choice application considered. You can find instructions for enrollment on the district website.

The following stipulations apply:

1. The student must be a full-time resident of Effingham County.
2. Space must be available after the school’s assigned students have been enrolled. For the 2024-2025 school year, **the following schools are closed for School Choice transfers:**

3. Any special programs required by the student must be available at the school requested. Policy JBCA Resident Students does not provide that the district allow for transfers to schools where special programs do not already exist.
4. Buses operated by Effingham County Schools are not authorized to transport students to and from addresses that are outside of the attendance zone of the school the student is attending. School Choice Privilege students will not be assigned a route on a school bus. Parent/guardians must find a way to transport their student to and from school. 5. In the event that a high school student has parking / driving privileges revoked due to a violation of JBD: Absences and Excuses, revocation or denial of a driver’s license by the Department of Driver Services, or is for any other reason unable to drive his or herself to school, it shall be the responsibility of the parent/guardian and student to arrange for transportation to and from school; otherwise, the student shall transfer to the zoned school where the student may utilize transportation provided by the school district.
6. In the event that more requests are received than can be accommodated based on space, requests from parents who are employed by the Effingham County Board of Education and those requests with attached documentation of legitimate hardship shall receive priority. Any remaining openings shall be filled based on order of application receipt.
7. Any student transferring under this law shall be subject to the eligibility requirements of the Georgia High School Association.
8. Each child in a family must submit a separate application. Approval of one child in a family does NOT guarantee approval of others in the same family.
9. Approval of students to transfer under School Choice Privilege does not guarantee that younger siblings will be able to attend the same school once they reach school age. If space is not available at a school the year a younger sibling begins Kindergarten, their application will be denied, regardless of the School Choice status of older students continuing at the same school.

10. School Choice Privilege does not apply to students applying for enrollment in a lottery funded Georgia Pre-K program. District procedure is to provide Pre-K enrollment preference to resident students and those eligible under Effingham County BOE Policy JBCCA Student Assignment to Schools.

Transfer Request Process

Step 1: Carefully review Effingham County Board of Education policies JBCCA Resident Students and JBCCA Student Assignment to Schools, located at www.effinghamschools.com, by navigating to School Board tab, BOE Policy drop-down. At the time of this release, we are not able to provide printed policies or applications at the Board of Education Central Office.

Step 2: Complete the online School Transfer Request form, which will be provided on the district website (www.effinghamschools.com) on Monday, March 25. If you wish get a copy of the form and mail it in, you can find it online or request copies from the Effingham County Board of Education Central Office beginning Monday, March 25 at 8:00 am. **Applications will ONLY be accepted via the online form or through US Mail. We will NOT take any hand delivered forms at the Central Office.** Parents will have the opportunity to submit documentation for hardship cases beginning June 1.

When you complete the online School Transfer Request Form, you will receive an email with a confirmation number for your application. This number is used to reference your request and confirm that we have received your submission. If you do not receive a confirmation email, please email registration@effingham.k12.ga.us and a staff member will be in contact. Applications will be accepted no later than **4:00 PM on April 19, 2024.**

Step 3: You will be notified of the acceptance or rejection of your application via email. Please do **NOT** call the Board of Education for a status update unless you do not receive your notification by **May 7, 2024.**

Additional Options Relating to the Georgia Special Needs Scholarship

Effingham County Board of Education Policy JBCCA Resident Students allows for any students in grades Kindergarten through 12th, including those students with disabilities, to request a transfer to another school within their school district of residence, provided the stipulations of the policy are met. If your child has an active IEP and you wish to be considered for a transfer to another Effingham County school, you will follow the same transfer request process explained in this notification as students not served under an IEP. The Georgia Special Needs Scholarship does, however, include additional options for transferring your special needs child to a state school, participating Georgia private school, or participating Georgia public school district. In order for any of these options to be exercised, the participating school must offer the programs required by the child's active Individual Education Plan (IEP). Students enrolled at a school operated by the Department of Juvenile Justice are not eligible for the Georgia Special Needs Scholarship.

State Schools Option: You may request a transfer to one of the state schools for the deaf and/or blind operated by the Georgia State Board of Education. Acceptance into the state school will be contingent on the appropriateness of the setting for your student. If you choose this option, you will be responsible for transportation to the state school. Private School Option: If you are interested in transferring your student to a private school in Georgia, you may be able to take advantage of a Georgia Special Needs Scholarship. These state scholarships provide funding that can be used to help pay for tuition costs at participating private schools in the state of Georgia. Transfer to Another Georgia School District Option: A school district considering a request for a transfer into its school system has the authority to approve or deny a public school transfer request for any reason. A school district considering a transfer can deny a request even if there is capacity and a program available that is aligned to the student's IEP within its system. If a request is approved, a school district can charge parent(s) / guardian(s) for the costs of educating a student from outside its school district. The Effingham County School System does **NOT** approve applications submitted for students who reside outside of Effingham County pursuant to the Georgia Special Needs Scholarship. If you are an Effingham resident, however, and are interested in transferring your child to another Georgia public school district, it is your responsibility to contact that school district to inquire about their acceptance of non-resident students pursuant to the Georgia Special Needs Scholarship.
