Opening activities give students a chance to flex their math skills and get ready to learn.


#### Learn something new

# ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL NEWS


I hope this finds you and your family in good health. I wanted to take a moment to express my gratitude for your continued support throughout the school year.

## COUNSELOR NEWS





#### KINDERGARTEN

This past month we have learned about Native Americans. Some of the specific items we learned about were the different tribes, comparing the different shelters, food, and ways of life within three different tribes. We are continuing to blend sounds to form words and writing complete sentences on topics we are learning about in reading. Some of our big vocabulary words we have learned are agile and feast. In math, we have been learning about number bonds. We are talking about the whole and parts of a number story. We also are working on how to sort objects in multiple ways to fil in a number bond.

## 2ND GRADE

Hello 2nd grade parents! We are so proud of the growth we are seeing in all of your students, keep up the good work at home! We are transitioning into a reading unit on the Civil War. The students will be learning a lot, so don't forget to ask them what they learned about during knowledge. Please continue to read with your kids at home because we are seeing that it is making a huge difference in their reading scores. In math, we are just finishing up shapes and moving into telling the time. Quiz them and have them tell you the time from your "old fashioned" clocks. Hopefully by the end of this unit they won't have to look at a phone to tell you the time! Stay warm!

## 1ST GRADE

In 1st grade reading, we have been working hard on our bossy r vowel sounds! These are er, ar, and or. 1st graders are practicing both reading and spelling words with these sounds in them. We have also started practicing syllables, learning how to decode longer 2-syllable words consistently and spell them as well! In knowledge, we have been learning about early American civilizations, such as the Maya and the Aztec. We will also be starting a few days of lessons about the Inca! In math 1st graders have been learning about measurement. We are practicing the difference between the words "longer" and "taller," and we have been using tools such as centimeter cubes to measure objects. 1st graders have been very creative finding things around the room to measure to practice their skills!

## ZRD GRADE

Third grade has been working hard on being leaders this semester. We have been learning about light and sound in reading. In our next unit we will be learning about Vikings. It should be an adventure! Geometry is our new focus in math. Students are relating geometry to multiplication and area. The students are really enjoying the hands-on work!

## TH GRADE

Fourth grade has been diving deep into the fascinating world of Geology in Reading! We have read informational text focused on volcanoes, earthquakes, mountains, and more! We have also been focusing on the use of quotation marks, adjectives, comma usage, and the breakdown of words (prefix, root word, suffix). In Math, we are having fun with fractions and are exploring how to represent and rename fractions, as well as find equivalent fractions. Students are continuing to make great progress and we look forward to seeing the growth students make in this second half of the school year!



### STH GRADE

Happy New Year! We are so happy to have our students back and working to get back into our routines. With the recent change of teachers, students have been adjusting extremely well and have continued their learning and studies in the classroom. We are quickly approaching crunch time that is wrapping up the school year and getting prepared for CMAS, the Colorado State Assessment. 5th graders will be taking three CMAS assessments, reading, math, and science. Please remind your child to complete their homework and studies so that they come to school prepared and ready to learn. Additionally, please begin talking with your child about good test taking strategies, trying their best, and overall, just encouraging them. We appreciate all that you do to support your child and love working alongside the Bricker Community to ensure success!



Over the last few weeks, we have been busy testing our CLDE students on their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills on a test called ACCESS. Our students have worked so hard and we are so happy to say that ACCESS testing is officially done! Make sure to ask your students how you think they did and praise them for their hard work. We will receive their scores in early May and will share those with you as soon as we get them. To celebrate the end of ACCESS testing, we will be having a donut party with our students!
