4. ANNOUNCEMENTS AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Information: A. School Spotlight: Alexander Tran - Villa Park High School

Student Board Member Alexander Tran from Villa Park High School expressed gratitude to the choir for singing the National Anthem. He also thanked Principal McCuiston, Activities Director Ms. Scott Sawyer, and his ASB class for joining him tonight. Alex talked about the Spartan apprenticeship program, where students are assigned to committees to learn the way of student leaders and assist them in achieving success both on and off campus. He explained that students learn how to plan dances, prepare sports assemblies, and contribute to the Spartan newsletter. Alex reported on the success of two club rushes, which raised several thousand dollars, and the noticeable increase in student organizations. He highlighted the successes of artistic programs like Choir, Color Guard, Pom team, and theater program, all of which contribute to spreading the Spartan spirit in the community and on campus. A video showcasing the school year was presented.

Information, Reports: B. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Gonzalez talked about Measure S, a bond approved in 2016 to fund facility modernization and construction projects at the four comprehensive high schools. As a result of our Phase I projects, OUSD students and teachers are utilizing just over 200,000 square feet of modern teaching and learning space across the campuses at Orange, Villa Park, Canyon, and El Modena High Schools. El Modena and Canyon also had HVAC units installed, with a helicopter being utilized at Canyon due to site logistics. A video was shown on placing the HVAC system with the use of a helicopter. Mr. Gonzalez explained that Phase II will provide additional campus improvements specific to each school site's needs and that the next video update will be shared after our new Senior Executive Director, Facilities & Planning, Isela Vazquez, gets settled in.

Information, Reports: C. Board President's Report

Board President Ortega welcomed everyone back. He mentioned that he looked forward to working with the students and the parents. He stated that he wants parents fully involved in the education of their students. He also mentioned the 7-11 committee which will be brought forward on the website and that he shared this with Legislative Committee members. He noted that misinformation is being spread about the recall and that he is looking into legal repercussions. Trustee Ortega suggested keeping item 4D, Board Recognition of Students, Staff and Community short.

Information, Reports: D. Board Recognition of Students, Staff and Community

Trustee Miner expressed excitement about the positive growth in both English Language Arts and Math performances for students with disabilities. She also highlighted the professional development pilot programs and monitoring processes that demonstrate the district's proactive stance toward improvements. Ms. Miner expressed gratitude for the district staff's efforts. She also encouraged the audience to write a letter to Sacramento in opposition to bill AB 734, which interferes with parental rights and decision-making regarding children's participation in sports.

Trustee Page welcomed everyone back and highlighted the Villa Park High School Dance Team's mini dance clinic for elementary school students, which attracted over 50 students. She also talked about the girls' and boys' basketball games where the high school dance team and the participants of the mini-dance clinic danced during halftime. Ms. Page highly encouraged the audience to attend a game. Trustee Page also informed the public that enrollment kicked off this week and that she helped Fletcher Elementary canvass the neighborhood to share flyers and explain the great things happening at the school. She also acknowledged Mr. Chris Drake, an Instructional Assistant at Fletcher, who has contributed to the growth of many students, and who is leaving to get his teaching credentials. She thanked him for his service.

Trustee Yamasaki welcomed everyone back and mentioned that she loved seeing all the employees of the year celebrations. She encouraged everyone to visit the OUCPTA Reflections Ceremony, held at the District Board Rooms on February 6th.

Trustee Rumsey congratulated Canyon High School for their win in the basketball game against Villa Park High School. She mentioned she was impressed with the song team and the cheerleaders who are also set to compete in Florida. She thanked Mr. Larios for giving her, Ms. Page, and the student board members a tour of the Spyderlab at Villa Park High School. She encouraged everyone to check out the book "Living with Parkinson's Disease: A Guide for Kids and Teens", written by Villa Park High School Student Morgan Schaffer.

Student Board Member Alex Tran from Villa Park High School mentioned the Showcase on January 31st and encouraged everyone to come.

Student Board Member Nancy Albano from Orange High School mentioned that the farm at the school has new steers, two baby sheep, and a new lamb. Nancy talked about the indoor assembly which had a great turnout as well as the annual Blood drive. She also mentioned the Showcase which will be held next week. Nancy is excited about celebrating 588 students with a 3.5 GPA or higher.

Student Board Member Davehna Ramirez from Richland High School discussed the "Blind Date with a Book" event, where wrapped books with quotes are displayed in the library and based on the quote, students will choose to read the book. Additionally, she mentioned that representatives from Santiago Canyon College visit the campus twice a week to assist students in exploring trade certificates and degree programs such as nursing, construction, or programming, and conduct financial aid workshops. She also reported that the leadership class is organizing Valentine's activities and a love campaign where students write on cards what they love about themselves and the world and those cards will be added to a giant banner intended to spread encouragement throughout the campus. She also welcomed the new history teacher, Mr. Kelaher.

Student Board Member Emma Hoffmann from El Modena High reported that the seniors hosted a movie night as a fundraiser for their class, featuring the film "Peter Pan". She also shared that the theme for the seniors during Spirit Week is "Seniors in Neverland". Emma also mentioned that the theme for the Winter Formal is "Red Carpet", and that underclassmen are invited to participate in the event. Emma further discussed attending Senior Wrestling Night with ASB and highlighted the strong support

the wrestlers received. Emma also mentioned that the Halo Club has been preparing for a Halo Dance for Autism, open to all high schools. Additionally, Emma explained that teachers have relocated from the 500 building to facilitate construction. **Student Board Member Jiya Patel** from Canyon High School reported that all the athletic programs are performing well. She highlighted the success of the Girls' Varsity Pom team which secured first place in USA Regionals as well as the winning streaks of both the Girls' and Boys' Basketball teams drawing packed student sections to cheer them on. Jiya mentioned that over winter break permanent shade structures were installed, a welcome surprise for which she expressed gratitude.
