## **Spirit of Giving**

I am so grateful for our students, staff and community members who give so *generously* to help individuals and families in need of support. Here are just a few examples of outstanding efforts in December 2023.









This holiday season, more than \$4,000 was collected from Orono staff—with an additional donation from Orono PTO—to purchase food for 70 families. Each holiday meal box contained a full-size turkey, 10 pounds of potatoes, gravy, corn, green beans, stuffing, rolls, butter, pie and whipped topping. In addition, <u>Orono Cares</u> was able to purchase more than \$18,000 in Target gift cards for these same families thanks to generous community donations. It's heartwarming to know that 100% of all donations through these efforts went directly to our local families.
