
AP School Honor Roll - Platinum Level

Last Monday, we received news that Orono High School has earned a place on the Advanced Placement (AP) School Honor Roll at the **Platinum Level** based on student achievement during the 2022-23 school year. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools that have done outstanding work to welcome more students into AP courses and support them on their path to college success. The Honor Roll offers four levels of distinction, with Platinum being the highest.

Orono High School met or exceeded the Platinum threshold for all three evaluation criteria:

- **college culture:** percent of students in the graduating class who took an AP exam any time in high school. For OHS, this figure is 80% with a Platinum threshold of 80%.
- **college credit:** percent of students who scored 3 or higher on any AP exam. For OHS, this figure is 66% with a Platinum threshold of 50%.
- **college optimization:** percent of students who took 5 or more AP exams in high school, where at least one exam was taken in 9th or 10th grade. For OHS, this figure is 36% with a threshold of 15%.

AP coursework provides early exposure to college-level work and contributes to a college-going school culture. We are so proud of our teachers, staff and students for their commitment to reaching higher and keeping their goals in sight!



Orono Partnership for Youth Coalition

We are excited to share that the Orono Partnership for Youth (OPY) Coalition, in conjunction with our district, has been awarded the federal Drug-Free Communities Grant through the Office of National Drug Control Policy. This has been a project several years in the making and we are thrilled to be able to focus on preventing youth substance use and increasing mental wellness in our learning community.

We are also delighted to welcome **Ali Chorley** as the program director and Gina Byers as the Coordinator. Ali is a 2004 Orono graduate with extensive experience in this area and personal knowledge of our community. She comes to us following a 10-year directorship with Wayzata Schools' "Partners in Prevention" program.

A hallmark of this program is the focus on building positive childhood experiences (PCEs) through the school environment that so greatly impact child development. For example, one PCE is *connectedness* and *pride* in your high school. Another is being able to talk to a *caring adult* about your feelings. These are all things we work hard to incorporate in our interactions with students. The goals of the OPY Coalition fit so well with our Character work and our focus on protective factors to promote student well-being.

I am really excited to get this work underway! Welcome, Ali and Gina.
