California State Dashboard

The California Department of Education unveiled the 2023 California School Dashboard in December. This marks its return, after the onset of the pandemic, to a system of color-coded ratings that illustrate the performance of schools and districts across various indicators. The color-coded spectrum is comprised of five performance levels, ranked from highest to lowest: Blue, Green, Yellow, Orange, and Red. The color rating is determined by combining the current year's results with the change in performance from the previous year.







Overall, **LGSUHSD** received the highest possible ratings in three indicators: suspension rate, graduation rate, and college/career readiness.

The Academic Progress in English and Math measurement is based on the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) results. LGSUHSD students have outperformed both state and Santa Clara County averages, with LGSUHSD ranking Number 1 in the state of California in Mathematics for comprehensive public high school districts.

Golden Bell State Award



The district has been awarded the 2023 California School Boards Association (CSBA) Golden Bell Award in the Student Support Services category for its food service program transformation: Edible Learning: Transforming School Cafeterias into Wellness Communities.

Spearheaded by Los Gatos High School

Administrator Kristi Grasty in 2019, the district worked with chef Paul Boundas, owner of Country House Kitchen, to create a plan that improved the cafeteria model while enhancing students' nutrition. What transpired was an incredible collaboration that would transform the way students are fed during the school day and a replicated program model that was successfully implemented at Saratoga High School. Therapy Dogs Provide Unique Support in School Wellness Centers

Entirely funded through donations from the Los Gatos Lions Club and the Saratoga High School Foundation, both high schools now regularly have therapy dogs in their Wellness Center for students. Research shows that therapy dogs provide significant antistress effects on the body, including student academic and social growth.



Available to students during lunch and breaks, as well as during class w

and breaks, as well as during class with a teacher's note, the Wellness Centers continues to be a popular destination for students at both campuses, as the number of students utilizing the Wellness Center continues to increase each semester in the three years since its inception.

We INSPIRE!, a Strategic Plan Update

The Board of Trustees adopted the 2023-2033 Strategic Plan, We INSPIRE!, at the October 17, 2023 Board Meeting. Developed in phases, district students, staff, parents, and community members have completed Phases 1 & 2, which share the district's vision, mission, graduate profile, and focus areas.





The Strategic Plan has four focus areas and goals. Each focus area has an implementation team which will determine the action steps needed to meet each goal, as well as the metrics required to measure success. Throughout the process, the district will seek the input and guidance of our community, including students, parents, community leaders, and teachers/staff. Scan the QR code to see the full plan.

School Funding Challenges

More than a decade ago, local voters approved Measure A. This \$49 annual parcel tax provides dedicated, locally controlled funding for programs such as robotics, rigorous AP courses, and award-winning music, arts, and world language programs. This source of funding is set to expire unless renewed.

Since Measure A was first approved in 2011, the cost of living and of providing an excellent education has continued to increase, while locally-controlled revenue for our high schools has remained stagnant.

The LGSUHSD Board of Trustees is exploring options to help local funding keep pace with the rising costs of providing a quality education. One option currently being explored is a ballot measure to renew the District's expiring local parcel tax, with a modest increase to the \$49 rate approved more than 10 years ago.
