



Seal of Biliteracy & Civic Engagement

The State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB), marked by a gold seal on the diploma or transcript, recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages, in addition to English. This year, the district is proud to honor 270 Seniors who have met the rigorous requirements.



In addition, the district is excited to announce that the Board of Trustees has recently approved the State Seal of Civic Engagement to be offered to Seniors beginning in the 2023/2024 school year. As one of only three districts in Santa Clara County offering this opportunity, the State Seal of Civic Engagement is awarded to students who have demonstrated excellence in civics education and participation, as well as an understanding of the US Constitution, California Constitution, and the democratic system of government. Understanding the District's **Budget & Parcel Tax**

California has two types of ways that school districts are funded: communityfunded (also known as Basic Aid) and state funded (formerly known as Revenue Limit). About 10% of California districts are community-funded, including the Los Gatos-Saratoga Union High School District.

A community-funded district receives the majority of its funding from local property taxes because local property taxes exceed the state's guaranteed perstudent funding amount. The state contributions to a community-funded district's budget are minimal.

Community-funded districts receive the same level of overall funding regardless of their school district enrollment since their funding is not tied to average daily attendance at their schools.

Community-funded districts face a unique challenge because funding is unrelated to enrollment. While community-funded districts typically have relatively higher property tax bases, districts do not know what their estimated property tax revenue will be until well into the fiscal year, and future year projections are subject to volatility. As a result, community-funded districts typically maintain a reserve level higher than the state required minimum. LGSUHSD has a board policy to maintain reserves of at least 10% of annual expenditures.

Community-funded districts often rely on parcel taxes to supplement their budgets, since they cannot rely on state funding and cannot predict property tax revenues.
