State Test Scores

The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) test

scores were released in October from the California Department of Education. Given in the spring of 2022, this annual assessment is given to public school students 90% in the State of California in grades 3-8, and again in grade 11. With a pause in this state test during the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school year due to the pandemic and remote learning, LGSUHSD student assessment data highlights how students collectively in the district



Wellness Centers

Wellness Centers are open at both Los Gatos & Saratoga High Schools as a layer of support to improve the health, well-being, and educational outcomes of high school students. Staffed with a dedicated Lead Therapist and Clinical Health Outreach Worker at each site, these Wellness Centers not only provide socialemotional learning opportunities, they also serve as early intervention to health, mental health, substance abuse, and other support services as needed. The number of students using our remarkable Wellness Centers continues to grow.
