



The Giving Tree at Lewis and Clark Elementary has been providing local families with meals during the holidays for 21 years. Each year, classes compete for most food items collected and special guests help weigh the donations. This year, the Pocatello Fire Department graciously helped with the competition. Jill Robertson, Lewis and Clark's Community Resource Worker, creates between 150-175 food boxes for families in need across the Pocatello/Chubbuck school district. According to Jill Robertson, "The angel at the top of the tree was made by a student on the very first year the program started. The student said she did not have enough food at home to share, but she still wanted to contribute to The Giving Tree. The angel represents 21 years of sharing kindness and support within our community."

The Greater Pocatello Association of Realtors continued their annual generosity by funding the purchase, coordination and wrapping of gifts for 8 PCSD 25 families identified with the help of our school Community Resource Workers. The gifts will impact 45 children who range in ages from 2 to 18. The gifts include games, clothing, toys, make up, gift cards for older kids to purchase clothing, and make up, as well as laundry, cleaning and hygiene supplies for some of those families.
